

A FAMOUS BRIGAND

ENDED HIS CAREER OF BLOOD AND MURDER.

Ferocious Fra Diavolo of Anatolian Mountains. Captured by Soldiers. Dies by Hand His Friend. Constantinople, Dec. 26.—The famous terror inspiring brigand, Tehakirdjiali, the terror of the Anatolian Mountains, the ferocious blood-shedder, Fra Diavolo of Asia Minor, has ceased to exist. He fell, with a loss of his faithful followers, in a desperate struggle with a large military detachment headed by Capt. Roubidi Bey. This struggle was fought on very unusual terms—four brigands against more than a hundred well-armed soldiers.

Tehakirdjiali's career, which has excited over many a mysterious incident, was a career of sword and fire, of blood and murder, of unspcakable cruelty, and boundless ferocity. He was coupled with chivalrous hardness. Tehakirdjiali was very often exceedingly compassionate and generous. His death was unaccompanied by a thrilling manner. There is a custom among the brigands of the Near East to kill themselves or to be killed by a fellow brigand rather than fall into the hands of authorities alive. Tehakirdjiali had a special benefactor, Mehmed by name, who followed him in all his dangerous, bloody exploits like a slave.

When both were captured by Capt. Roubidi, the Ottoman Fra Diavolo remained Mehmed of the custom, sanctioned by tradition and usage, and of the national laws. Mehmed did not hesitate to demand, and with a sturdy, well-balanced blow of the Damascus blade, cut off the head of his leader whom he had loved more than his own self, and then pierced his own heart with a dagger. The dead bodies of the brigands were brought in triumph, with song and dancing, to the governor of Smyrna.

Young Mehmed (Tehakirdjiali's "Christian" name) had a father of extraordinary piety, named Ahmed, whom he loved with the passionate devotion of a violent, impetuous nature. Once upon a time Ahmed quarreled with an Ottoman official, an Albanian by nationality, and was killed by him. The cruel loss filled the youth with an ardent desire for revenge. His method of retaliation was first of all directed against Albanians. He began to hate them with a fierce hatred.

His first victim was the murderer of his father. He saw now for the first time human blood upon his quivering hands. The scent of it begat ferocity, which knew no bounds, no restraint, no mercy. It was the beginning of atrocities that eclipsed all the previous terrible records of brigandage by their intensity of cruelty and recklessness, and this in Turkey, which is the country of brigandage par excellence.

After his first murder he flew into the mountains, and soon began his regular, formidable, highwayman career. At that time Kiamil Pasha was governor of Smyrna, the brigand-hero's birthplace. True to his vows, he shortly afterwards commenced to kill the Albanians wherever and whenever he met them. More than 400 of them, it was said, fell victims to his ever-increasing blood-thirstiness at that time alone.

Soon the news of his exploits spread throughout the whole of the Ottoman empire. People began to tremble at his name, and those in authority, who had spurred his appeal to avenge his father, fled before the news of his approach. His attitude towards women was of a chivalrous character. He is said never to have in any way molested representatives of the fair sex. His politeness and gallantry towards them were genuine, and were supposed to have been due to the influence of his wife, a quiet, gentle country-woman. In all quarters of the Near East he had women who were devoted to him to the highest degree, and were always ready to serve him, however dangerous might be the task.

It was mostly due to these self-sacrificing services of women that Tehakirdjiali was able to elude, for so many years all the attempts of the authorities to capture him. Women used to hide him for weeks in their houses, supply him with food, keep him well informed of all the movements of his numerous persecutors, and guide him through secret paths upon dangerous neighborhoods. A rich notable of Smyrna, Abdurrahman Bey by name, agitated in stature and strength, had once boasted that if he could meet Tehakirdjiali face to face he would bind him, bring him on a special steamer to Constantinople, and put him in iron fetters at the very feet of the sultan.

One night Fra Diavolo appeared in the bedroom of the notable and quietly said, "I have heard of you, and I have come to you for your impudence." The nature of Abdurrahman was unimagined. The sudden appearance of the brigand terrified him and he fled. He never, for Tehakirdjiali, "I only took proof program."

OUR CREDIT ABROAD.

Is it Suffering Because Our Borrowings Are Too Frequent?

Wrote Sun, Toronto. At the last session of the Dominion Parliament, proposed bond issue of the Canadian Northern was guaranteed by the Dominion government to the extent of some \$95,000,000. The purpose of this bond was to provide funds for the building of the connecting link in the Canadian Northern system from Selkirk Junction, north of Sudbury, to Port Williams.

The bonds listed under this Dominion guarantee, and for the purpose stated, were lately offered on the London market. Although the security bears interest at the rate of three and one-half per cent., and were offered at ninety-three per cent. of their face value, thus making the actual rate rather better than three and three-quarters per cent., the lending public could not be induced to accept the offering and it is understood that Sir William Mackenzie is now trying the market in Paris. What has occurred in regard to this Canadian Northern loan should serve as a notice that we have been over-straining our credit. In the last ten years we have increased the indebtedness of the Dominion itself by \$29,000,000, in five years the provincial indebtedness of Ontario has gone up from something over thirteen to more than twenty-two million dollars; the municipal debts of this province increased from \$61,000,000 in 1902 to \$94,000,000 in 1905. In addition to all this, up to the end of the fiscal year of 1910 the bonds of private railway corporations had been guaranteed by various governments, Dominion and provincial, to the extent of over \$127,000,000. Clearly we have been over-doing our borrowing and guaranteeing and now people with money to lend are refusing to discount our notes. If what has happened in regard to this C.N.R. loan is merely a prelude to a general shortening up in our credit in the money markets of the world, and a forced curtailment is put to the spending of borrowed capital, we may be rudely awakened to the fact that a good deal of our wanted prosperity has been resting on a very unstable basis.

The Census in Canada. Rochester, N.Y., Express. In the census report by the Canadian minister of agriculture, it is shown that the population of the Dominion consists of 3,395,250 males and 3,370,937 females. While there are more men than women in Canada, the women predominate in Toronto by 4,000; in Hamilton by 2,500; in Ottawa by 3,500; in Quebec by 3,500. In the maritime provinces the women number 172,023 and the men 179,565, but in St. John's city and county the number nearly 1,500 more than the men. There are 10,000 more males than females in Nova Scotia. In Halifax the sexes are almost equal in number—40,061 males and 40,197 females. In Western Canada the men are largely in the majority, due to the nervousness of the women, and it is consequently that the men are more numerous in the prairie provinces have not yet sent to England for the feminine portion of their families. Manitoba has an excess of 45,000 males, Winnipeg 12,000. In Saskatchewan there are 90,000 more men than women, in Alberta 73,000, in British Columbia, 106,000.

Confuse Presents to the Immediate Family Circle. To put Christmas on a "sane" basis, the World's League for a Sane Christmas has been organized in Indianapolis, and it plans to spread its propaganda among all Christian nations. Proceeding on the theory that Christmas has been commercialized until it has become a burden to people generally, the league will appeal to them to return to the Christmas spirit of the long ago and to confine the giving of presents to the immediate family circle, says The Philadelphia Record.
