The dowager empress and the seven-year-old emperor of China are fleeing towards Zibkhe on the Mongolian frontier.

Michael Bello's nose was cut off with a razor in a fight in Albany, N.Y., on Sunday.

Homeless boys who keep a boarding house in local option St. David's, was fined \$25 for having liquor on his premises.

Statistics show that 423 persons were killed by vehicles on the streets of New York in 1911, 121 by autos alone.
