STROPSIS OF CANADIAN ROBIH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 15 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta

Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of a: least 50 acres solely owned mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price, \$2,00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the fime required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three rears, cultivate fifty acres, and arrest ears, cultivate fifty acres and erect house worth \$300.00.
