





Chicago, Jan. 20.-"Three-fourths of the high school graduates are females and only three per cent, of the criminals are females; therefore, why should women not have the ballot?" This argument was offered in favor of woman suffrage by Mrs. Hine Rewei, of New Zealand, before the Cook County Teachers' Association in Fullerton Hall, yesterday. Mrs. Rawei, and her husband, Prof. Wheahiko Ra-

wei, spoke on conditions in New Zea-

"I meet so many people who argue said Mrs. Rawei. "In view of th large percentage of women that are graduated from the high schools and the small percentage of woman crim inels, such a statement is absurd and ridiculous. In New Zealand we do not hold accident of sex as an insult or a discredit to women."
