And to Seek Strength in Prayer. Sermons by Rev. Prof. E. Johnson Ross, of Montreal, at Queen's and in Chalmers Church.

Rev. Prof. E. Johnson Ross, principal of the Presbyterian College, of Montreal, and one of the most eloquent preachers heard by a Christian audience for some time, was the speaker at the Sunday afternoon service at Queen's University yesterday.

His subject was "The Transfiguration," but his address took the form of a heart-to-heart talk with the large number of students present.

He urged upon them in passionate tones the necessity of prayer. He said people did not know the value of prayer and its effects upon them, but for prayer, the Master would never have survived the mental tortures in the garden of Gethsemane.

While the offering was being lifted, Guy Atwood sang "Fear Ye Not O Israel," in a splendid baritone voice. Prof. Ross occupied the pulpit at Chalmers church Sunday night and delivered a strong sermon dealing with the many aspects of the gospel.

Henry Sugarman's Good Record Saved Him From Heavy Fine in Police Court—First Case to be Tried Under Weapons' Act.

It pays to have a good record. Henry Sugarman, second-hand dealer, Ontario street, found this out, in police court, Monday morning. Sugarman sold to Charles E. Heroux, of Caswell man, Ont., a revolver with which the latter committed suicide in the waiting-room of the Kingston and Pembroke railway station, two weeks ago.

W. F. Nicksle appeared on behalf of the accused, but had no statement to make, the accused having simply admitted his guilt. "I am willing, in this case, to allow you to go on suspended sentence," remarked the magistrate to Sugarman.

Magistrate pointed out that the minimum fine for such an offence was \$25, and stated that if there should be another case of this kind a penalty would be imposed.
