NEW YORK GIVEN A GLIMPSE OF FUTURE.

A Twentieth Century Craft—Blind Lighthouses—The Montauk Improvement—To Transform Governor's Island.

New York, Feb. 17.—New York harbor enjoyed a glimpse of the future, during the week, when a series of spectacular flights were made, at a great altitude, by hydro-aeroplanes.

Lighthouses along the coast may be made ten times as effective, it is claimed by equipping them with wireless apparatus.

Unless New York city awakens to the necessity of improving its harbor facilities along the lines of the great European ports it will soon face a serious problem.

The plan is to improve the harbor by the construction of a signal system with the installation of this proposed chain of wireless stations along the entire seaboard.

Plans are being considered by the war department for erecting a great military prison on Governor's island, in New York harbor.

FIND BOILING LAKE IN GULF OF MEXICO.

Sailors Report Spot of Hot Water Near Texas Coast, Probably Due to Submarine Explosion.

Galveston, Tex., Feb. 17.—A lake of boiling water in the Gulf of Mexico is reported by vessels having passed through and around the strange phenomena at a point in the western gulf about 280 miles south by east of the Texas coast.

The area of hot water was variously given as ranging from a half to a mile in circumference and seamen claim it is unquestionably due to an explosion on the bottom of the sea of some volcanic eruption as the water appeared to be greatly agitated in several places within the hot lake.

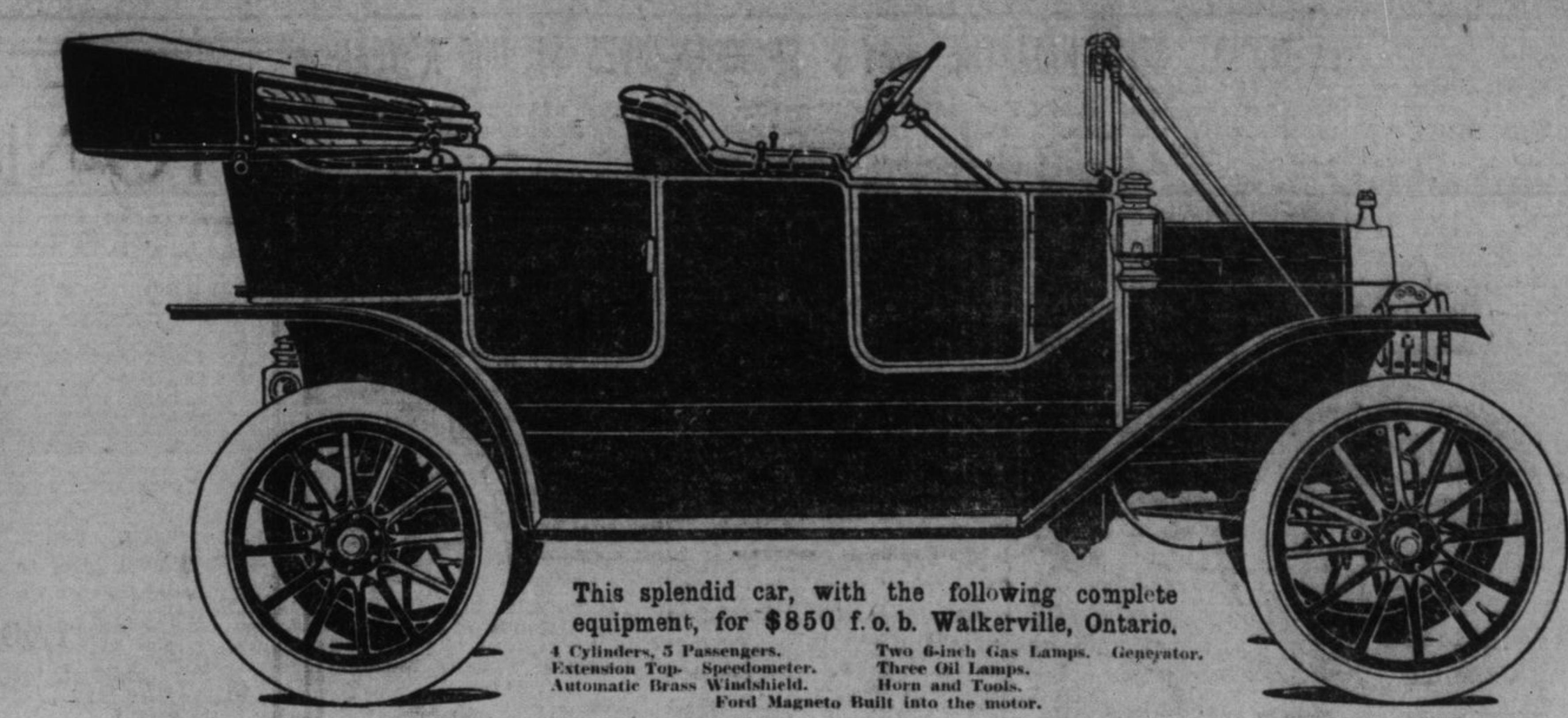
Men Voters Put to Shame.
