



MAYOR A POKER SHARP. Caught Cheating at His Club and Fined \$200.

Paris, Feb. 20.-M. Seebe, man and Mayor of Setif, a Important town in Algeria, has been fined \$200 for cheating at poker in the City Club. It was a municipal councilor who made the complaint against the Mayor and obtained the nominal damages, one franc, that he demanded as personal satisfaction.

The mayor's method of operation was simple. Regularly he dealt himself six cards and he got rid of the extra card in making his discard. His success aroused suspicions; he was watched and a clear case established against him. When the case came up in the

police court the magistrate dismissed it, approving of the mayor's defence, which argued that as the Mayor's manoeuvre did not give him a certainty of winning he was not guilty of swindling. The case was taken to the appeal court, which was either less inclined to hairsplitting or less open to mayoral influence.




