If the church of God is defective, then the work of God shall surely be hindered.

In the church there should be no crities. The church of to-day should not merely have a fine choir and organ, carpeted floors and fine seats, but should have something more in it than that. The word of God was supposed to be preached at home and abroad, but how many of us ever think of preaching it in foreign lands? We may have everything in the line of these things, but if we fail the main business of the church, then our church is useless.




