**Maiden:** Your thin, stringy hair can be made to come in thick and fluffy if you avoid alkali shampoos. The most beneficial thing for cleansing scalp and hair is a cold emulsion of soap which dissolved in a cup of hot water is enough for a delightful shampoo.
