THE SEVENTH OF MAY

FIXED FOR HEARING OF THE NE TEMERE CASE

By the Supreme Court of Canada—The Government Test Case Was Presented on Monday Morning.

Ottawa, March 11.—The marriage law reference by the dominion government, arising out of the Lan-aster bill and the operation of the ne temere decree, will be heard by the supreme court on Tuesday, May 7th. This was the decision of the chief justice when deputy minister of justice E. L. Newcombe, K.C., this morning, submitted the application for the hearing of the court. There was a full attendance of judges, namely, Chief Justice Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Sir Louis Davies, Hon. Justice Idington, Hon. Justice Duff and Hon. Justice Beckett. The seats within the bar were filled with a great array of counsel. In addition to Mr. Newcombe were Hon. Wallace Nesbitt, K.C., I. F. Helmuth, K.C., Eugene Lamer, K.C., and P. B. Mignault, K.C., all retained by the dominion.

Messrs. Nesbitt and Mignault will argue in support of the right of the dominion parliament to legislate, and Messrs. Helmuth and Lamer to argue on behalf of the other side of the argument. The province of Quebec was represented by R. C. Smith, K.C., and Aime Geoffrin, K.C., with Auguste Lemieux, K.C., of Ottawa, as counsel. E. A. Lanaster, M.P., was an interested spectator.

Queen's University bill will be taken up in the house, this evening. Mr. Nickle, M.P., is anxious to put the bill through to-night, and it is thought it will go through.

Mr. Nickle intends to stay with it to the last. Strong protest against the measure have been received from the Jews of Montreal, Toronto and Winnipeg, who claim that the bill, as it now stands, will shut out the Jews from holding professorships. So great is the interest in these remarkable pictures that a syndicate of Wall Street financiers have made an offer of \$15,000,000 to buy out the American and Canadian rights of the corporation controlling the invention, but the offer has been refused by Henry J. Brock, of Montreal, president of the American and Canadian companies.
