A NAPOLEONIC PLOT SAID TO BE SCENTED IN FRENCH WAR MINISTER'S MOVE.

Paris Fears That it is Proposed to Have Next President Elected by a Plebiscite in 1913.

Paris, March 12.—The second innovation of Minister of War Millerand in the grand spring military review met with the same success as his revival in the military tattoos, in which some regiments of the Paris garrison paraded with its band every Saturday night.

The greatest enthusiasm was displayed over the evolutions of two dirigible balloons and eight aeroplanes, especially when the latter passed a few yards in front of the stands. The officer pilot was plainly visible as he saluted President Fallieres.
