SCHOOL NURSE'S WORK

IS DOING A GREAT DEAL FOR RISING GENERATION.

How System is Worked Out, and Great Service it Renders to Scholars—Great Check on Spread of Contagious Disease.

That the public school nurse, Miss Jean McAlum, is filling a most important position—one that is doing a great deal for the rising generation, is a certainty. Anyone who is familiar with her work, is at once struck with the importance of it, and the wonder of it all is, why such an appointment was not made by the board of education long ago. However, conditions years ago probably did not call for work of this kind.

It will be remembered that Kingston's school nurse commenced her duties about the middle of September last. The question of her appointment was carefully considered by the members of the board of education, and it was finally decided that it would be a step in the right direction to have a nurse appointed, and as the board is at this time endeavoring to do all in its power to help the children, and to give them every opportunity possible, to prepare for the battle of life, the appointment was made by a unanimous vote, and the wisdom of the board in this matter will not for one moment be questioned.

To use a common expression, the scheme is one that has "made good," will continue to do so, and the members of the board are to be congratulated on their action.

The importance of such an appointment can be understood when it is noted that several cities in Canada adopted the same plan of appointing a school nurse, and all along the line there is very encouraging reports about the work.

At the last meeting of the board of education, the inspector, J. R. Stuart, was asked for his opinion in regard to the matter, and without any hesitancy whatever, he reported that good work was being carried out. The inspector is the man who is in the schools every day, and who knows just what is going on, so he ought to know. In a short time, Mr. Stuart will present a detailed report to the board on the working of the system, and it should prove very interesting reading.

In brief, the scheme followed out is as follows: The school nurse is at work every day, making her rounds of the different schools. She keeps tabs on the scholars, and where a "case" is found, she immediately acts upon it, and follows it up at the home, until it is finally disposed of. She visits the homes of the children, and gives all necessary instructions to the parents.

It all appears very simple, but it has wonderful results. In the first place, it is a check on the spread of contagious disease, and for keeping cleanliness, there could be no better scheme. All sorts of cases are discovered—just little ills of childhood, but of the character which, if allowed to go their way, would be a great drawback to the sight and defective teeth, are quite common, not to mention many others.

And it must not be forgotten that the school teachers, as well as the nurse, play an important part in this work. They are with the children all the time, and when they notice anything wrong, they, of course, notify the nurse, and the case receives prompt attention. It must be understood that the nurse does not play the role of a doctor. She does not treat the children, but simply gives the instructions, and if her instructions are carried out, there should be no trouble. Since the system has been

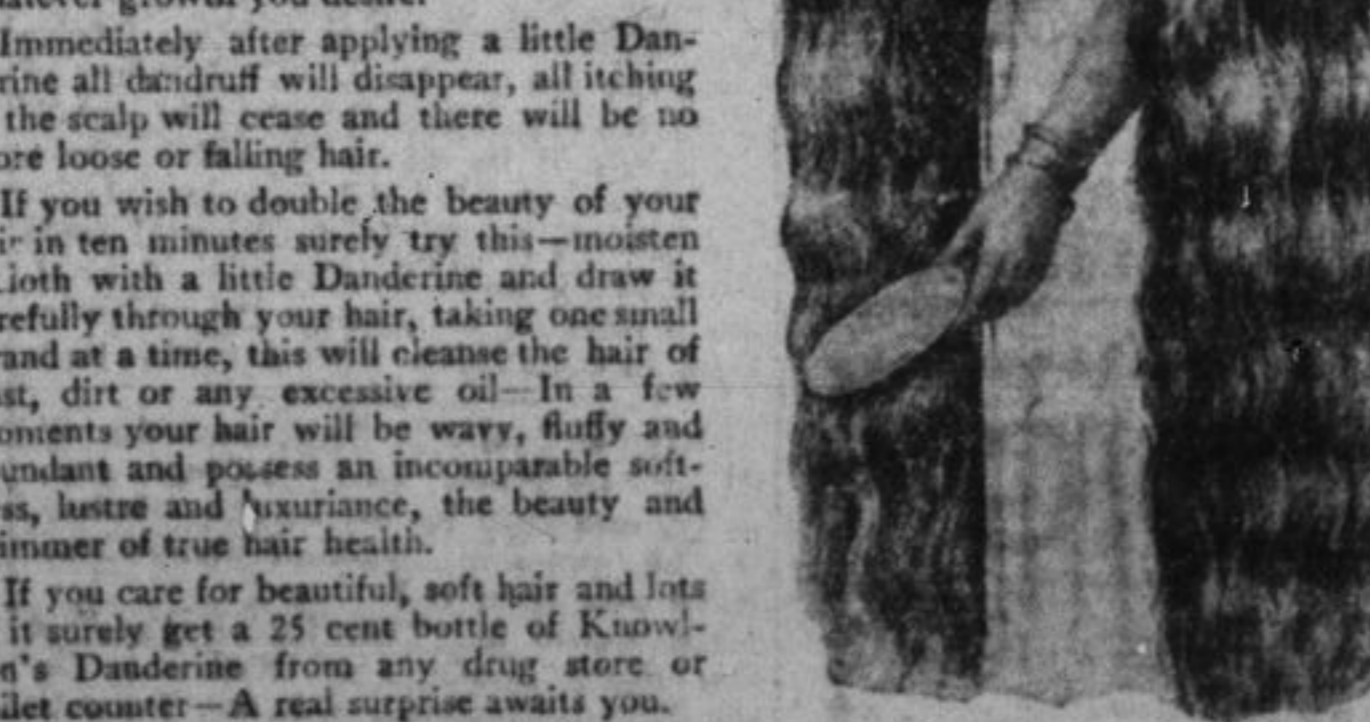
