HINCKLEY ON THE JOB.
Will be First to Reach Alexandria Bay with a Steamer This Year.
An Alexandria Bay dispatch says: Although the ice is firm on the channel of the river near this village, and there is not an open stretch of water to be seen, Captain A. R. Hinckley is here, and says he will wager that he will bring his freight boat, the Hinckley, from the wreck of the schooner near St. Lawrence Park to Cornwall's wharf here on Saturday of this week. Only a few days ago teams crossed the channel, and it has been freezing weather since, but the captain says it will break up this week enough to let him run through the channel. He is working on the wreck of the barge now, and expects to take her to Kingston before many days.

NO FURTHER WORD RECEIVED

From G.T.R. Company About Power For Quarry.

Manager C. C. Folger, of the city's light, heat and power department, has received no further word from the Grand Trunk Railway company, as to a supply of power for its quarry, which it proposes opening this spring in order to get a supply of metal for grading its roadbed from Montreal to Toronto. It will be remembered that the company asked the city if it could supply it with 600 or 700 horse power. Manager Folger will write the company, and see if it intends to go ahead with its project and as to when it will require the power. The city plant can give it all it requires, even if no outside power is brought in for some time.

MUST PAINT THE POLES.

This morning, City Engineer McClelland issued orders to the telephone, telegraph and street railway companies and the city's light, heat and power departments that all their poles on the streets must be painted this spring, as they have become most unsightly.
