AN HOSPITAL COMMISSION.

The recommendation of Dr. U. H. Clark, of Toronto, and based upon a long and valuable experience, is that the insane asylums and hospitals should be wholly removed from politics. And he is right. The treatment of the insane requires a class of skill and care, on the part of the medical attendant, and assistants, which cannot be provided by any political appointment.

It may seem to the politicians that any kind of talent will do, and there is always an abundance of the material which a political party or boss has to offer for government preferment. But the insane are entitled, charitably, to the best care and treatment the government can afford, and if it can be selected non-politically, by an independent com-

BI-LINGUAL SCHOOL TROUBLES.

The row over a bi-lingual school, in school section No. 4, township of Springier, will spread, and the government may have to face a very serious difficulty. The taxpayers are largely English, but the pupils at the school are largely French, and the teacher, according to the record, has not been able to give the scholars the training they need. For thirteen years all the school section could get was a third-class teacher and under her the third book has been the limit.

The inspector, who is a French-Canadian, says the school has suffered because the trustees will not pay more than \$300 per annum, and the building is unfitted for school purposes. The teacher, for insubordination, for teaching catechism when she was told not to do it, was dismissed, and then the French and Irish pupils were withdrawn.

PRISON NOT THE PLACE.

The Whig does not know what court sentenced him, but it feels that no boy, or youth in his teens, should be committed for two years to the Kingston penitentiary. Not that this institution is not a model of its kind, but all prisons and penitentiaries are schools for crime, in our opinion, in place of schools in which the erring ones may be corrected. His home has been faulty, or he has had no home, or he has had parents who have been wholly unfit or incompetent to train or educate their children.

And every youth who is forced to herd with the men that usually lodge in the penitentiary must suffer a further humiliation and loss of moral stamina. Against such commitments the press and people should not cease to protest until the administrators of justice are moved to make reforms. A boy who offends and is not a hard-

FEELING IN THE WEST.

Conditions in the west are very depressing. The Whig a while ago quoted from a Regina paper with regard to the losses the farmers had suffered through their inability to market the grain. Again comes the report, this time from a special correspondent of the Toronto Star, and to the effect that the distress continues, and that it is manifested in an intensified degree.

The producers have done their best to realize upon their crops of 1911. They have conveyed the grain to convenient shipping points. They have stacked it there, some of it under cover, some of it in the open, in bins or enclosures, and some of it piled up in the railway yards like coal. Upon it they have raised loans from the banks, for two, three or more months, at a high rate of interest, and these loans cannot be met even now, in April, because the grain has not been sold. Thousands, yes hundreds of thousands, of bushels, have been lost. It has been left on the farms, where it was threshed, to waste for lack of transportation facilities. The loss collectively to the farmers cannot be calculated. It is approximately many millions of dollars.
