OLD KING'S LETTERS FOR SALE. Interesting Historical Documents Included in List at Auction. London, April 10.—The sale rooms of Messrs. Sotheby on April 25th will be the scene of one of the most interesting auctions of autograph letters and historical documents that has taken place in London for some years.

Two of the most notable letters are one written by Charles II from Whitehall in February, 1678, to the Duke of York, requesting him to withdraw to the continent, and another one written by Sir Thomas Boleyn, father of Anne Boleyn, to Cardinal Wolsey, in which, after detailing the court news, he shows the strong position which Henry VIII then held in the councils of Europe, and expresses his earnest hope that the projected meeting between him and Francis may take place.

IRISH HOME RULE BILL

BEFORE THE BRITISH PARLIAMENT ON THURSDAY.

What It is Expected to Contain—Difficulties That Are Hard to Overcome—The Financial Features.

Toronto World. Inters in the home rule bill to be introduced in the house of commons by Mr. Asquith on Thursday appears to be keyed up to as great a pitch as it was on the eve of Mr. Gladstone's first essay on that behalf. The present attention is no doubt in part due to the change in the parliamentary centre of gravity.

Various forecasts of Mr. Asquith's proposals have been published, the latest with sufficient precision to suggest a basis of authority. According to this anticipation the Irish legislature will enjoy only delegated powers, while the exercise of these even will be doubly and triply supervised in some respects will have less scope than the provincial legislatures of Canada and its act will be under a control which is intended to be close and effective.

Not until the bill reaches the committee stage will there be afforded occasion for the emergence of internal dissension among the members of the coalition majority. Two of the principal issues raised may test its solidity—one, the position of the Irish members in parliament—the other, the nature of the financial arrangements. Unless those members are to be allowed to vote on questions affecting England and Wales amounting to virtual independence or an impairment of the supreme jurisdiction of the imperial government and legislature.

CHICAGO DRAINAGE PLAN. Americans File Answer to the Canadian Objections. Ottawa, April 11.—The answer of the Chicago District Sanitary Association to the objections raised by the Canadian government and the Canadian Marine Association to the application to lower the level of the great lakes was received here, yesterday. Five days have been given to the Americans to file their answer after the American secretary of war at Washington. The Canadians have ten days in which to consider this answer, and then the whole question will be decided by the American secretary of war. The international waterways commission will, of course, give the final decision if there is an appeal.

Yankees Become Canadians. Ottawa, April 11.—To judge from the extremely heavy immigration traffic for Canada which continues to arrive via the United States port of Portland, Maine, it would appear as if that city had been temporarily annexed by Canada for her own use. Steamer after steamer for months past has unloaded record numbers of immigrants of whom all but a fraction were destined to Canada. All previous records for passenger arrivals on Thursday last, when the steamship Zealand from Rotterdam, specially chartered by the White Star Dominion line in connection with the Red Star line, landed no fewer than 1,559 passengers.

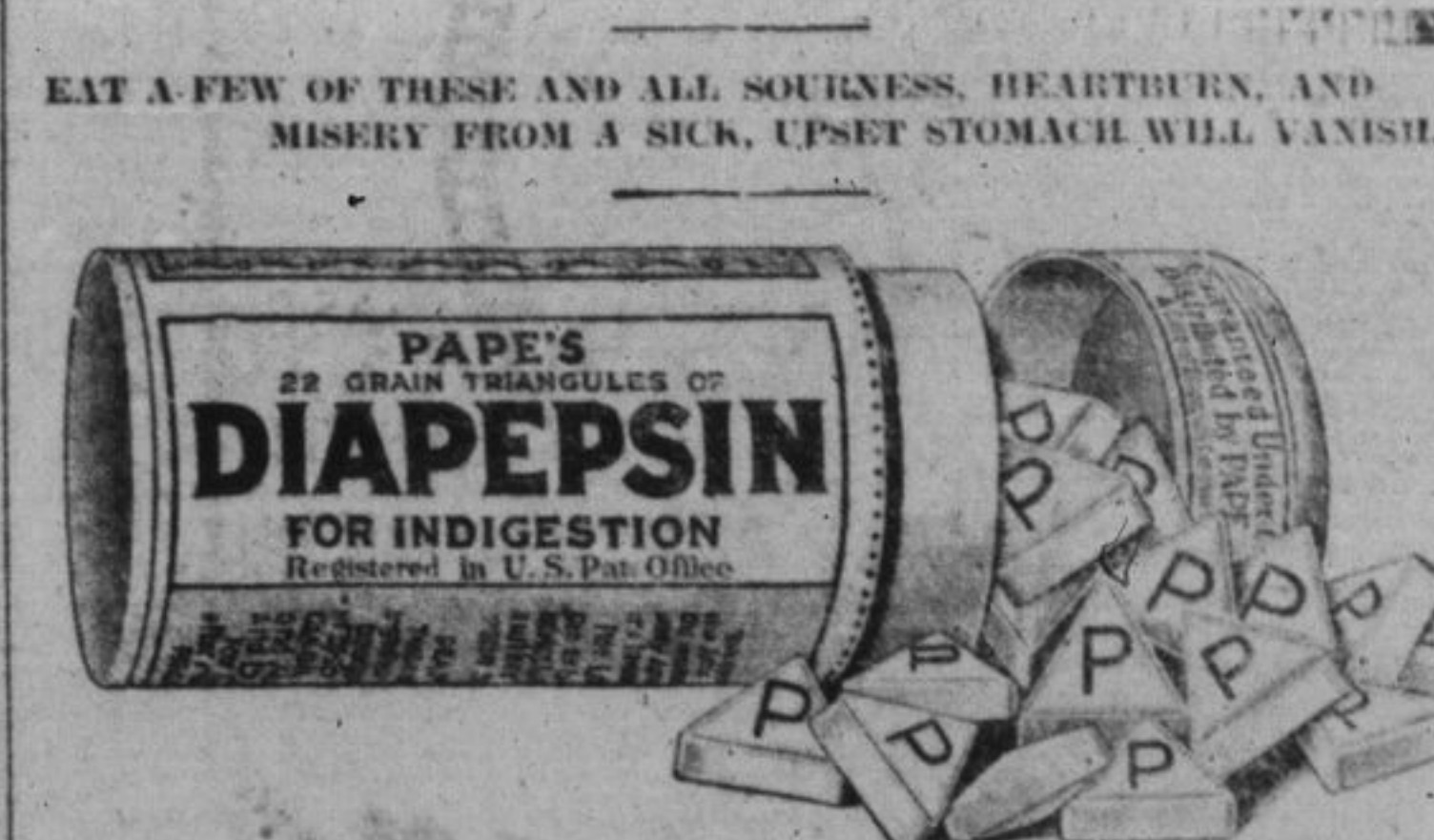
Strike Aid to Mexico's Woes. Mexico City, April 11.—American conductors and engineers employed by the national railways of Mexico will walk out April 15th unless some unforeseen circumstance intervenes. The railroad managers today refused the demands of the men. The last had already voted to strike if the company's reply was unfavorable. Nearly 800 employees are affected by the strike decision.

General Booth's Birthday. London, Eng., April 10.—Eighty-three years old today is General Booth, and this morning he issued a message of hope and cheer to the world. His only infirmity is his blindness. He can scarcely see one glimmer of light, though physicians say that after an operation he may have ten years partial sight.

MORE TEACHERS NEEDED To Supply the Needs of Ontario's Schools. Toronto, April 10.—Willis C. Frosts, school inspector, speaking on the teacher supply at the Ontario Education Association this morning, said that an adequate supply of trained teachers was at the present of most vital importance to the welfare of the province. "We need immediately 1,400 teachers," he said, "and from 500 to 800 more yearly than the present yearly output. But if every school room had a qualified teacher under present conditions, the salaries would again sink almost to the level of fifteen years ago. The normal schools must need yearly at least fifteen per cent. of those attending, simply as an educational protection."
