Prison For Apprentices.
Few Londoners know that there exists a special place of confinement in which the City Chamberlain has power to commit disobedient apprentices. In Bridwell Hospital, close to Fleet street, are, however, a few cells which are practically the only remains of the old building that stood on the site of a one-time royal palace at Blackfriars. The Bridwell was given by Edward VI. to the Lord Mayor for use as a workhouse for the poor and idle, and the hospital, which remained from this gift, is still governed by the aldermen.

These cells are occasionally occupied for brief periods by refractory apprentices, who are brought before the City Chamberlain in his court at Guildhall, and, if he finds that they are incorrigible, he commits them to Bridwell for a week, or, in exceptional cases, a fortnight or twenty-one days, the lads thus escaping the bad influences of an ordinary prison.

For Two Bishops.
The veteran cricketer, Dr. W. G. Grace, has probably been photographed and has given his autograph at many times as most celebrities. At a meet the other day a wee maiden approached him with notebook and pencil for his autograph, which was gracefully accorded with the cheery smile and good-natured manner for which the genial old champion is so well known. On another occasion a fortnight later, much to his surprise, the same little lady shyly sidled up to him with the necessary documents and the request for his autograph. "But I gave it to you only a few days ago," laughingly said the veteran. "Oh," came the answer, "I changed that one for two bishops."

A Queer Hermit.
Isaac Sheath, who has just died in the workhouse at the age of seventy-eight, lived the life of a hermit for nearly forty years at Newport, Isle of Wight. He occupied a mud-hut which he erected on a piece of waste land in the village of Chale, but the hut became so dilapidated that the rural district council ordered its destruction. Sheath was greatly exasperated by the council's interference, and before he left for the workhouse he burned the hut to the ground. Mice and birds had grown accustomed to the old man and his lonely ways, that they used to come and feed from his hand.

The Brown Clan.
Ever since 1700 there has existed a charitable society in Glasgow known as the Browns Society. The number on the roll at the present moment is 200, or only two-fifths of the strength of the Brown clan as recorded in the city directory. This number is probably not more than a tenth of the actual Brown "residents," a dreadful word, as Prof. Masson used to say. The society is not restricted to Browns only; husbands, wives, or descendants of Browns are eligible for membership. Of the twelve members comprising the directorate ten are Browns.

Our Knowledge of Napoleon.
Occasionally, "Knowledge" deals with archaeological and historical subjects, and in this month's issue Mr. A. M. Broadley, the well-known authority on Napoleon, clears up all the doubtful points with regard to the posthumous portraits and death masks of Napoleon the Great. He publishes, too, for the first time the statements of accounts which were made between Assistant Commissary Ibbetson and Count Bertrand, three weeks after Napoleon's death.

Left to Good Uses.
It pays to be a surgeon. The late Lord Lister, of London, who discovered the antiseptic system for the treatment of surgery, left an estate amounting to \$2,500,000. A large part of it he left to medical institutions, and with the singular request that the donor's name should not be coupled with the benefaction. Lord Lister's experiments on animals led him to formulate the theory, which he afterwards developed in practice. And yet, he was one of the most gentle, kind and humane of men. This is an argument that the anti-vivisectionists will find it hard to overcome.
