IT WAS A CRIME

To Allow Charles M. Hays to Die on Titanic.

Amesbury, Vermont, formerly of Kingston, writes an interesting article in the Detroit Journal on this question: "Were the men heroes who gave up their lives to save women from the sea?" Mr. Burrows declares that some men should have been saved in preference to some women. His statement is as follows:

There is one modification to the practice of "women first" which should commend itself to right-thinking people. There should be created a class to which both sexes should be eligible—a class of people who should be regarded the property of the world, and not servants of humanity; and these should be given precedence over all others, without regard to age, or sex. There was at least one of these on board the Titanic—a man of such greatness and of such supreme value that to allow him to die was a crime.

MAN WHO RECEIVED BOMB

Owens a Palatial Thousand Island Residence.

Watertown, N.Y., April 29.—The A. R. Peacock mentioned in Pittsburg dispatches as having received a bomb and a demand for \$10,000, is well-known at the Thousand Islands, having one of the finest homes in the millionaire colony opposite Alexandria Bay, Mr. Peacock's summer home is known as "Belle Isle," and was formerly owned by George C. Boldt. His line of racing boats is the largest at the islands.

In connection with the bomb episode, William Pastorius, agent for a German art concern, has been arrested. The bomb sent to Mr. Peacock contained two sticks of dynamite, so arranged that when the lid of a box was opened a spring would strike a cap.

Some few days ago Mr. Peacock's receipted a letter asking for \$10,000 to be left in a Pittsburgh park. A "dummy" package was made up and left at the designated place, the arrest of Pastorius following.

MERGING OF BANKS

Is Not for the Good of the Common People.

Toronto, April 29.—"This latest merger of the Royal and Traders' Bank bodes no good to the banking fraternity," said Peter Ryan, this morning.

Mr. Ryan has made a special study of the banking systems of Canada, United States and several European countries. "This merger," continued Dr. Ryan, "means a further limitation of credit, which is falling more and more into the hands of the few. It means that it is going to be more difficult for the small manufacturer and town merchant to secure money, while money will be drained from the town and country into the big cities for the use of the men who deal in stocks on Wall street. This tendency to monopoly and combine is reaching the limit. It is becoming preposterous. Do you suppose people are going to stand for all these combined banks?"

The merging of small banks with big ones is not for the good of the common people."

At the consecration, on Wednesday, May 1st, of Rev. J. H. Conroy, an auxiliary of Ogdenburg, N.Y., Canada's Farthest North will be in charge, with about 125 clergymen from various sections of the country.

Canada will be represented by Archbishop Gauthier, of Ottawa, and Spratt, of Kingston.

LAKE MICHIGAN'S NARROW ESCAPE. Captain Counted Thirty-five Great Bergs in Ice Field.

London, April 29.—The Canadian Pacific steamship Lake Michigan arrived at Port London Saturday three days overdue. She reports that she had a narrow escape from being sunk while crossing the Banks of Newfoundland. The Lake Michigan was 180 miles from the Titanic and in the same ice field. Her captain says he heard the distress signals, but was unable to make an account of them. He counted thirty-five enormous ones.
