**MUSICAL KING.**

Victor Emmanuel Makes Boito a Senator.

Rome, April 30.—In the list of twenty-three new senators who have just been nominated by King Victor Emmanuel, the name of Arrigo Boito, the famous musician and friend of musicians, figures conspicuously.

The clause in the statutes specifying the qualifications for nomination in the senate says, "for brilliant services in the sciences, belles-lettres and the arts," but so far whenever artists or scientists have become senators it has been under the nomenclature of professional societies, or else as landowners.

Boito, who ranks among the most eminent musicians in Italy, is nominated as professor and member of the Royal Society of Naples.

Arrigo Boito is a native of Padua, though Milan is his city of adoption, the city in which his work, "Nerone," the completion of which has been so eagerly awaited, will be first given.

It was in Milan, also, in 1862, that he obtained his first success which sent him to Paris and to the society of Verdi, Bellini and Rossini.

The name of Boito is integral to the chronicle of music and literature of the period. A musician and a writer, he has kept in close touch with the various influences and personalities, which have contributed to the evolution of music both at home and abroad.

"Mephistopheles," his chief work, was performed in Bologna in 1875. It is the work for which he is best known by the general public.
