The Welsh clergy sent their proctors to the convocation of Canterbury two hundred and fifty years before Wales sent representatives to parliament. In 1870 the first motion in favour of the change was made and defeated by an overwhelming vote, and this is regarded as the more significant as it followed a year after the disestablishment of the Church in Ireland. It was revived in 1894 and has been kept before the people of Wales ever since. It became a leading question in the last elec-
