MISSIONARY'S PLEASURE.

Like a Story From the Arabian Nights.

Berlin, May 21.—An elderly man named Liebe, living in a suburb of Berlin, a retired missionary of the Catholic church, took atropin, and shortly afterwards died from the effects of this powerful poison.

He had been engaged in some domestic work with his housekeeper, and feeling ill said he would take a glass of brandy or liqueur. He went to a cupboard and took therefrom a bottle bearing the name of a well-known Amsterdam distillery, and drank a few minutes afterwards.

How did Liebe become possessed of the poison, secondly, was there any reason why he should commit suicide? Liebe was not in debt. His diaries show that he was even meditating matrimony, and had begun the necessary steps to procure a dispensation.

The official appointed as receiver of his property discovered in an iron case locked in an ordinary wooden cupboard a treasure which reads like a page out of "The Arabian Nights."

Carefully arranged in little boxes were 230 sapphires, 218 diamonds, 164 turquoises, about 50 opals, a number of rubies, and a large number of fine pearls. But his greatest treasure seems to have been a sacramental chalice of unusually large dimensions, thickly encrusted with most valuable gems, rough and cut. Of valuable stones alone there are 438 in this wonderful hoard.

We hear of amethysts, emeralds, rubies cut in the shape of a heart and of great stones bearing other stones which had been set into them. This cup is said to have been designed by Liebe himself and fashioned by a Paris goldsmith. Its value is estimated at \$15,000, and the total value of the other loose stones is said to be between \$50,000 and \$75,000.

In addition there is a splendid collection of ancient rings, and other valuables have been discovered of great interest to antiquarians. An excellent collection of Dresden ware was also part of this singular man's treasure.

It appears that earlier in life Liebe was employed as a missionary in India, Japan, and elsewhere, and he is believed to have accumulated his stones, etc., in these countries in dealings with the natives. Although his relatives knew he was a collector they never dreamt that he had acquired treasure to this extent.
