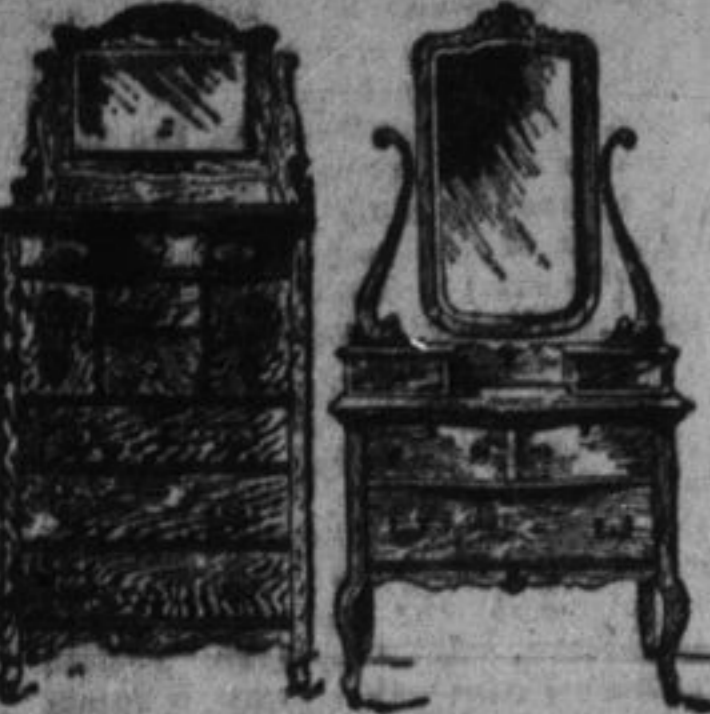

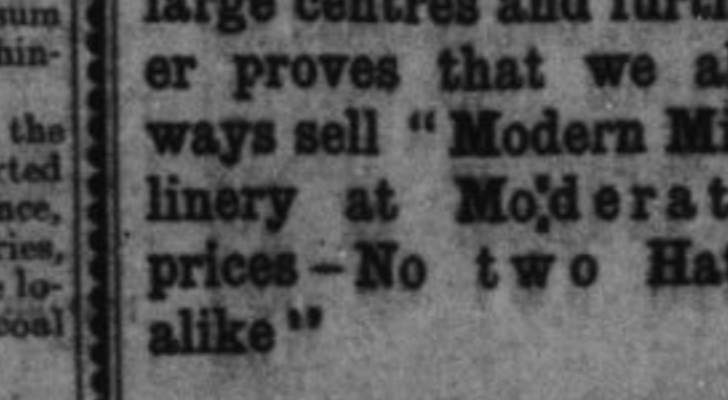

A Costly Policy. Ottawa Free Press.

The commonwealth of Australia is discovering that it is easier to launch on a new policy than to forecast its cost.

Official figures show that the cost of administering the old age pensions system in the commonwealth last year was nearly £2,200,000, a very heavy undertaking for a population of some 5,000,000 people.

Out of every 10,000 of the population 171 persons are in receipt of old age pensions and 17 of invalid pensions, with the total increasing by an average of 900 per month.

These figures will give surprise to some of the advocates of establishing old age pensions in Canada, and while they indicate a serious financial burden, they also indicate a lack of personal thrift and foresight which, we hope, is not prevalent in Canada.

On the other hand, it may be said that it is the duty of the state to provide for the old age of its people.
