

taken up by the members of the Kingston board of trade, the Kingston & Pembroke railway has decided to put on a daily freight service between Kingston and Renfrew, commencing June 3rd, next. This is good news to the whole sale merchants in the city, and they are pleased at the action of

the company. The matter, it will be remembered, was take up at a meeting of the board of trade, held on March 12th. The wholesale section of the board, through R. J. Carson, presented a report, submitting the complaints of merchants against the Kingston & Pembroko railway, owing to the fact that the company did not carry freight every day, to stations on the other side of Sharbot Lake.
