SPECIAL INSPECTOR

APPOINTED TO KINGSTON BY U.S. GOVERNMENT.

He Will Look Over All Baggage of Passengers to the United States—Secured Through Efforts of Consul Johnson.

The special United States customs inspector, appointed for the summer months for the port of Kingston, has arrived, and commenced duty on the steamer Kingston, on her down trip, Saturday morning. The new official came over Friday night accompanied by S. W. Day, of Ogdensburg, N. Y., special agent of the United States treasury department, and Frank Lowe, collector of customs at Cape Vincent, N. Y.

The new official will inspect all baggage of all through passengers to the United States from Canada and, from present arrangements, will go down to Prescott on the R. & Q. steamers every morning, and return to the city between four and five o'clock in the evening. Baggage will be inspected on board, the passengers being occasioned to no delay when landing. Any passengers leaving Kingston for any point in the States, by informing the new official of the fact, their baggage will be gone over by him, no matter what line of steamers they are travelling on.

This special inspector has been secured for this port through the efforts of F. S. S. Johnston, the U. S. consul, and Mr. Johnston has further advised that this official be appointed permanently, instead of acting only up to October 1st.
