In course of a letter addressed to the two ministers in question his majesty

"The people in general who own landed and house property, when the time arrives for being called upon by the authorities to do so, have to pay taxes on the same in proportion to the extent of each person's possessions. Apart from the official side, I consider myself as being any ordinary person. The property which I possess, comparatively speaking, may be said to be considerable; and if the govern ment would like to have a share of the income therefrom I shall be both willing and glad to part with the same as a contribution towards the maintenance of the state and nation like any other ordinary individual.

"Accordingly, henceforth I request you to levy taxes on all landed and house property which are considered my personal possession in the same of the public in general."


