### OUR FETES AND PARADES.

The Orange order will demonstrate on Friday and will, by its parade and the speeches which are incidental to it, have a revival of its faith. All institutions which defend upon the enthusiasm of its members, which enthusiasm is subject to many passing influences—are the better of public occasion whereon there may be a contemplation of their work. Orangeism had its rise in the peculiar relations of the people of Ireland, in the sixteenth century, and these relations became so strained in the time of William of Orange that the contending sides were armed and given to violence. The order took its name from this noble prince and its inspiration from his exploits and service.

### CLEANING UP THE CITY.

The Literary Digest recounts the steps that were taken to clean up Pittsburgh, after it had invited and received the inevitable reproach of being one of the "wickedest cities in the United States." The Literary Digest summarizes the story from the Continent, (of Chicago), for which it was written by W. T. Ellis.

Pittsburgh's decent people had endured the disgrace as long as they could, and then they acted. They formed the Voters' League. They preferred fifteen counts against the official who was primarily responsible for existing conditions, the Director of Public Safety. The social evil in residential sections had caused results of a frightful nature. The vicinities of settlements, schools and churches were not spared from open evil resorts. The growth of perverted practices and their public exhibitions had been permitted with demoralizing consequences. Liquor was sold in unauthorized places, the police permitting it for graft. Gambling flourished. The right to sell privileges to illegal resorts were believed to be trafficked in by the officers of the department. Violators of law with political influence were protected and the underworld was used for political purposes.

Similar indictments were made against other officials, and the council was asked to institute an enquiry, and according to its revelations apply a remedy. But the council did not act, and the Voters' League prepared to take action. It embraced representative men of all classes. It appealed to the civic government in vain. Then it adopted Men and Religion tactics. It called meetings in the churches. It made exposures general. It advertised the council as a

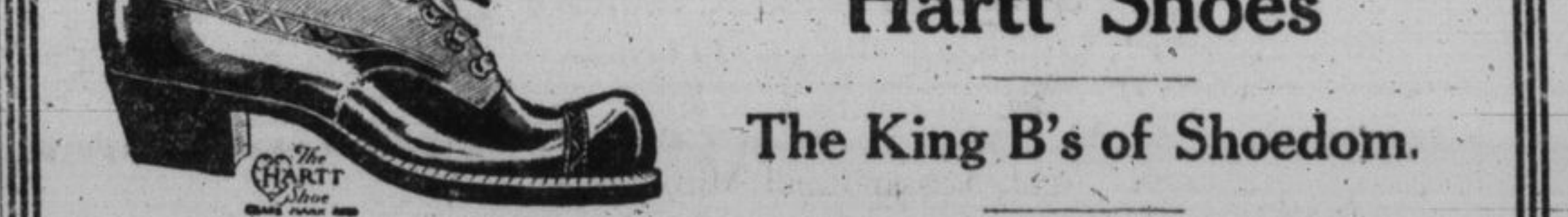

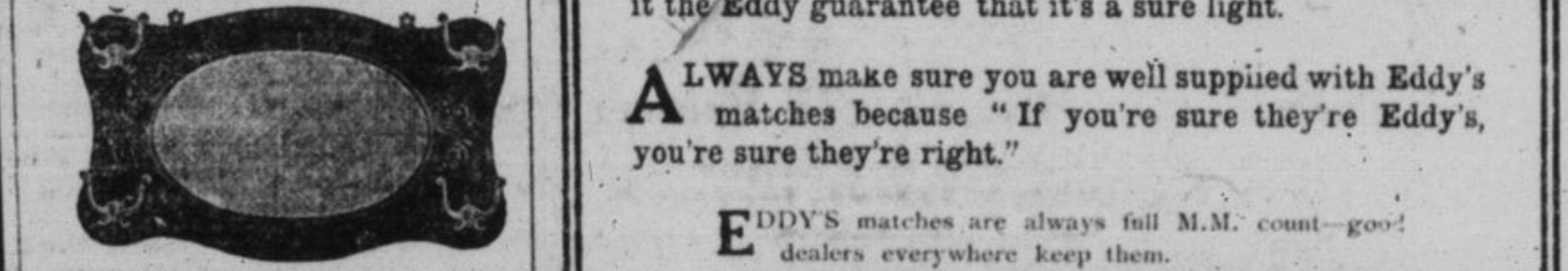
