A CRUISE TO STELLA

BY THE FLEET OF THE KINGSTON YACHT CLUB.

Temeraire won the Big Yacht Class and the Little Nell won in the Small Class—The Yachtsmen Made Things Lively at Stella.

The fleet of the Kingston Yacht Club left on a cruising race, Saturday afternoon, the objective point being Stella, and a very interesting contest took place. The smaller yachts ran under a special handicap. The Baby Grand and Little Nell starting at 2.30 and the Harmony at 2.57. The two former boats had a hard fight for first place, the Baby Grand maintaining a lead as far as the Brothers, when the Little Nell slipped by and took the lead in the lighter wind, which was blowing then. The veteran skipper of the Baby Grand could not make out just how it happened. One explanation of it is that the Little Nell's first mate was a breeze sailor and supplied the motive power while the Baby Grand, not being a wind instrument, was at a disadvantage. Trouble might have arisen between the two skippers but the Harmony sailed in between them to second place, and the race ended peacefully. The boats reached Stella in the following order:

It was intended to continue the cruise on Sunday to McDonald's Cove but the heavy rain kept the crews in their cabins until noon, when a start was made for home.
