J. H. Clary, crown attorney, of Sudbury district, has mysteriously disappeared since Thursday afternoon.

Telegraphic communication with Prince Edward Island has been interrupted by breaking a cable since July 11th.

Col. Samuel Hughes has left for the west. On August 21st he leaves for England to attend the annual military manoeuvres.

Dr. Murray, a dentist, of Brooklyn, N.Y., was drowned while bathing off Road's Point, two miles west of Port Colborne, Ont.

Dr. John N. E. Brown, formerly superintendent of the general hospital, Toronto, has been appointed to a similar position in the city of Detroit.

The attendants at the Louvre, Paris, arrested a woman who was dabbling with red ink. The woman was apparently insane.

Head down, and buried nearly up to the waist, Basil Gordon Collins, aged eleven, was found dead by his father, on the lake shore, Balm Beach, Toronto, Sunday morning.

Near Claysville, Pa., William Lorimer, of the Illinois senate, recently deprived of his seat by the United States senate, was cut, bruised and stunned when his automobile was wrecked late Sunday afternoon.

After a chase that covered several states and lasted several weeks, Sam Lee, a Russian immigrant suffering from what is declared to be a pronounced attack of leprosy, was located in Buffalo, N.Y., and placed in an isolated ward at the Ernst Wende hospital.

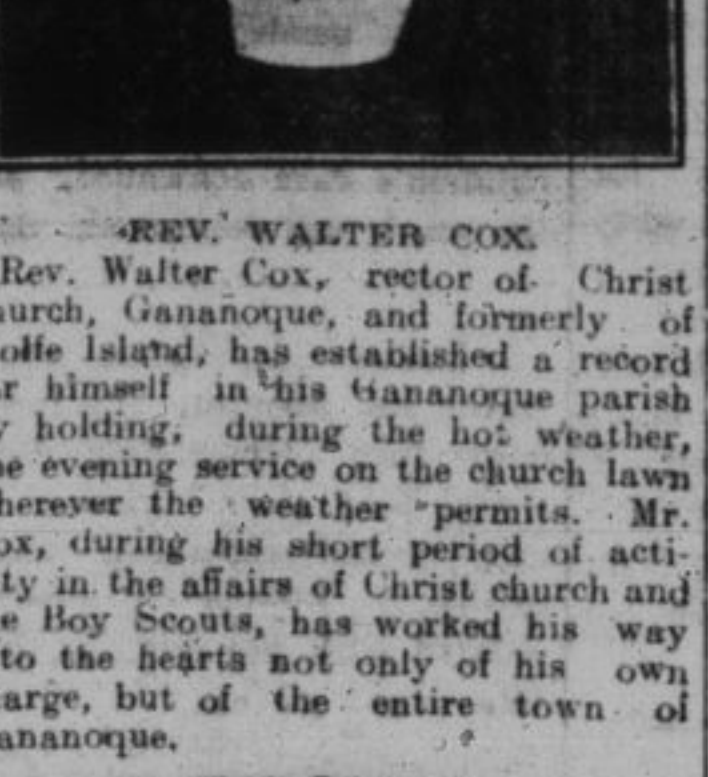
Miss Lois Ball, daughter of John Oscar Ball, a wealthy New York lawyer, living in Rochelle park, an exclusive section of New Rochelle, found a negro under her bed, Saturday night and dragged him out unassisted and sat on him until her father came with a revolver.

Tewfik Pasha, the Turkish ambassador at London, made it a condition of his acceptance of the mandate to form a new cabinet that the present chamber of deputies should be dissolved. The sultan refused to agree to this and Tewfik has accordingly declined the offer.

The proposal for the establishment of reciprocal trade relations between Australia and Canada is daily gathering strength in the commonwealth. The Brisbane Chamber of Commerce adopted a resolution favoring the project, while at Brisbane traders have hopes of its accomplishment at no distant date.

Postmaster General Hitchcock, of Washington, issued a statement, Saturday, which showed that the total number of arrests for defrauding the people through the mails up to the close of the last fiscal year, June 30th, was 1,063, and the amount of money filched by these criminals out of the American people is conservatively stated at more than \$120,000,000.

DANGERS OF COCAINE.
 From Charles B. Towns, in the August Century.

The most harmful of all habit-forming drugs is cocaine. Nothing so quickly deteriorates its victim or provides so short a cut to the insane asylum. It differs from opium in two important ways. Man does not acquire a habit from cocaine in the sense that it is virtually impossible for him to leave it off without medical treatment. He can do so, although he rarely does. On withdrawal, he experiences only an intense and horrible depression, together with a physical languor which results in a sleepiness that cannot be shaken off.

Opium withdrawal, on the other hand, results in sleeplessness and extreme nervous and physical disorder. In action, too, cocaine is exactly the opposite of opium, for cocaine is an extreme stimulant. Its stimulus wears off quickly and leaves a corresponding depression, but it confers half an hour of capability of intense effort. That is why bicycle riders, prize fighters and race horses are often doctored, or "doped," with cocaine.

When cocaine gives out, its victim invariably resorts to alcohol for stimulus; alcoholics, however, when deprived of alcohol generally drift into the use of morphine.
