THEY WILL WAGE WAR

THE COMMERCIAL EXCHANGES WILL HAVE TO FIGHT.

Politicians are After the Chicago Pil—Report that Spring Crop is Beyond Danger.

Chicago, July 23.—It is realized by foremost members of the commercial exchanges of the country that they will have to fight for their lives during the next two years, as a struggle is promised which will be the most severe they have ever experienced. For years it has been the custom of congressmen and senators to introduce bills aimed at speculative trading, or gambling, as they call it. But the action of the democratic party in its platform puts a new phase on the situation, and one which is calculated to give the exchanges more trouble than anything they have encountered so far. The plank is a recommendation to congress that laws be enacted to suppress the "pernicious practice of gambling in agricultural products by organized exchanges or others."

Example for Canadian Roads.
 Minneapolis, July 23.—Nearly 10,000 grain cars were built by roads having headquarters and terminals in the Twin Cities, according to officials of the road today, who declared that the cars would be rushed to grain producing points in order that there may be no drought of rolling stock.

Appointed Engineer.
 Toronto, July 23.—Hamin Brooks Hatch, mining engineer in Porcupine, has accepted the position of field man with the Canadian Exploration company, organized by Ambrose Monell, and will do work under the direction of Engineer Bateman at the Dome mines.

Another Setback.
 Montreal, July 23.—Amalgamated Asbestos shareholders who have been having hard luck lately received another setback when the Standard mill at the Theford mines was burned to the ground. The mill, which was owned by the Amalgamated company, was largely covered by insurance.

Loan Unsuccessful.
 Ottawa, July 23.—London cable announces Toronto has been unsuccessful in trying to float its permanent loan there, and has been forced to place twelve months' treasury bills for £1,200,000 at 4 1/2 per cent, plus expenses.

May Increase Dividend Rate.
 Montreal, July 23.—Quietly and without any appearance of ostentation Belle Telephone stock has been advancing in price at a very rapid rate since April last, and unlike several other prominent issues, the advance has not apparently been influenced by any speculative movement.
 The company's record of earnings for the past four years was as follows:

1911	1,425,836 or 10.53

It will be observed that net earnings for last year were less than for 1909 and 1910, but the gross for 1911 was nearly \$1,000,000 greater than for 1910, and \$1,500,000 greater than for 1909.
 It is pointed out that reason for the decreased net earnings in 1911 is that operation and maintenance expenses were heavier. Last September \$2,500,000 of new stock was offered to the shareholders which, when all paid-up, will bring the paid-up capital up to \$15,000,000.
 The new capital was for the purpose of extensions, etc., and the revenue will undoubtedly be augmented this year through its expenditure.
 The company has been conservative in the payment of dividends, no increase having been made since 1902. The rate is 8 per cent. per annum, or 2 per cent. quarterly, and it is only reasonable that the "Street" is looking for an early increase.
 The company has set up strong reserve funds, which adds stability to the company's position. In 1909 the several reserve funds amounted to \$5,200,000; in 1910, to \$6,148,000, and to \$7,108,000 in 1911.

Domestic Textile Due.
 Montreal, July 23.—Recent rises in the price of raw cotton and predictions of a much further increase during the coming year have attracted considerable interest to the stock of the Dominion Textile during the last week or so. If one might judge from the apparently excellent position in which the company stands from a producing and managerial standpoint, one might say that the stock was due for a considerable rise. This has been predicted for the past month or six weeks, but so far the public seems to have practically ignored its existence.

Details of New Car Company.
 Toronto, July 23.—Sir John Gibson, Toronto, will be the president of the new National Steel Car company, which was organized a short time ago. Basil Magor will be vice-president and general manager, and Adolph Metz secretary-treasurer and purchasing agent. The company expects to be far enough advanced to be able to deliver its first shipments of cars to the railways by November next.

Financial Items.
 Approximately \$35,000,000 pounds of copper wire were produced by mills of the United States, Mexico and Canada reported to the Boston News Bureau during the first half of 1912. This was a record tonnage for a like period.
 Reports that harvesting had spread as far north as Minnesota and that except in a few counties the whole spring crop of the United States was practically beyond danger from rust made Chicago wheat market heavy. Closing prices showed 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 net decline.
 (Chicago sales: London, 12 1/2c. to 12 3/4c.; Belleville, 12 1/2c. to 12 3/4c.)

AWD TO IMPERIAL NAVY.

Is the Definite Pledge of Premier Borden.

London, July 23.—Winston Churchill, first lord of the admiralty, in the course of his notable speech on common sense, said:
 "We have had repeated conferences with Mr. Borden and his colleagues at the admiralty, and they are now in possession of all the facts. We discussed with them with the utmost freedom and confidence what action should be taken to surmount the difficulties obstructing such action. So far as the admiralty is concerned, there will be no difficulties which shall not be surmounted. There is, however, a strong distinction between measures dealing with the requirements of the immediate future and the elaboration of a permanent naval policy. The latter will require much fuller discussion than has been possible hitherto."
 "Mr. Borden and his colleagues authorized me to say that they shared this view and that any special action which the immediate future may require of them will not be delayed. Pending the settlement of a permanent naval arrangement they wish that the aid of Canada shall be an addition to the existing British programme, directly strengthening the naval forces of the empire and affording a margin available for its security. They tell me that the action of the dominion will not be unworthy of the dignity and power of Canada. More than that I am not entitled to say. The decision of the Canadian government will not be announced until the ministers have returned to Canada. Meanwhile, I would suggest that the less the question is speculated upon the greater the public convenience will be."
 Earlier in his speech, referring to the Right Hon. R. J. Borden, prime minister of Canada, who was in the gallery, Mr. Churchill paid a tribute to the efforts of the Canadian ministers, but declared that no announcement of policy would be made until Mr. Borden and the other dominion ministers who had been in conference with the admiralty had returned to Ottawa and consulted with their colleagues.
 "It has been," he said, "a source of comfort and encouragement during these last few weeks to have by our side the prime minister and other ministers of the dominion of Canada. It has been like the touch of the hand of a strong friend when serious business is to be done. The task of maintaining the naval power of the empire under existing conditions is a heavy one. All the world is arming as it never has before. We have to protect dominions and territories scattered over every continent and every ocean as well. We understand the truth of Mr. Borden's words, that the day of peril is too late for preparations."

Dangers of Syringe.
 From Charles B. Towns in the August Current.
 I have seen over six thousand cases of drug habit in various countries of the world. Ninety-five per cent. of the patients who have come to me taking morphine or other alkaloids of opium have taken the drug hypodermically. With few exceptions I have found that the first knowledge of it came through the administration of a hypodermic which has shown the sufferer what was easing his pain. Restricting the sale of the syringe to physicians, or to buyers on a physician's prescription, is the first step towards placing the grave responsibility for the drug habit on the shoulders of those to whom it belongs.

Provincial Health Officer Makes an Explanation.
 Toronto, July 24.—Dr. John W. S. McCullough, chief officer of health of the province, has informed Works Commissioner Harris that he is not opposed to the use of sand filtration for water from Lake Ontario. "I think it is, for this water, the best system of purification at present known," he says. Dr. McCullough says his refusal to approve of sand filtration for water for the city of Ottawa was purely a local matter, so far as Ottawa was concerned.

The Best Travelled Over.
 A very gratifying tribute to the Grand Trunk railway was paid by the British manufacturers, before their departure, when, in conversation with a prominent official of the company, it was given as their common opinion that the trip over the G.T.R. had been made with greater comfort than that over any other road. This was attributed to the good roadbed, the smooth track, and the superior sleeping car accommodation.

The Fire Record.
 Marmora, July 24.—W. Smith, McLean, lost his barn and contents by fire. The blaze was noticed about 3 p.m., and it is thought that the building was struck by lightning, although the storm was not severe. Mr. Smith had his feet burned in getting a valuable horse out. The animal's back was burned. There was only about \$300 insurance.

How Ontario is Depleted.
 Montreal, July 24.—Grand Trunk railway officials stated that \$3,500 worth of families in older Ontario had left for the west this year, and had settled along the route of the G.T.R. or in Peace River district. Every one of the farmers had at least \$500, while many of them had much more.

A member of a New York banking house with London connections reports that the belief is taking hold in Canadian financial circles that when parliament convenes the Canadian Pacific railway will apply for authority to increase the amount of its authorized common stock and capitalization.
 The C.P.R. telegraphers get a board of conciliation in their dispute with the company. Peter McDonald, of Toronto, is chairman.
 The British postmaster-general says there is little hope of reduction in newspaper postage rates.
