The Very Latest Culled From All Over the World.

Four valuable colts were killed by lightning near Kendall. Three Chinese lepers now in Montreal are to be deported. Lloyd-George will introduce a bill to prevent labor disputes. 185 YEARS OLD. Age Officially Established by Church Record. Mazatlan, Mexico, July 24.—An official investigation into the claim that Jose Calvario, who died a few days ago at Tuxpan, was 185 years old, has been made, and it is announced that it was fully established by church records that he was born in 1727. During a period of more than seventy years before his death he was known to the people of the town where he lived as the oldest man in the world. He was active in getting about the streets until a few days before his death.
