TO END SLAVERY

INFAINTLY SIGNED PETITION FORWARDED TO PREMIER.

Punish the Culprits—United States Involved in Grave Responsibilities.

London, July 25.—A petition, signed by Most Rev. John Baptist Crozier, archbishop of Armagh and primate of all Ireland, (church of Ireland); Sir Rev. James Jencks, puberary of Hamilton, St. Paul's cathedral; Sir John Jardine, M.P., and Lady Jardine; Noel Buxton, M.P. for Norfolk; Rev. J. H. Harris, of the anti-slavery society, and Archdeacon Potter, in regard to the Peruvian outrages, has been forwarded to Premier Asquith.

We desire to point out that it is the duty of Great Britain, acting with the United States, to take steps to put an end to the slavery system in the Amazon district.
