That Balloon Sensation  
It Was Caused by Two Boys With Toy Airship.

Upon further investigation to Whig learned, on Wednesday, that the "balloon" which dropped in the harbor on Tuesday afternoon, was a large box kite, J. H. Sutherland saw two large boys go out into the harbor after two o'clock in the afternoon, with a box kite, six to eight feet in length. 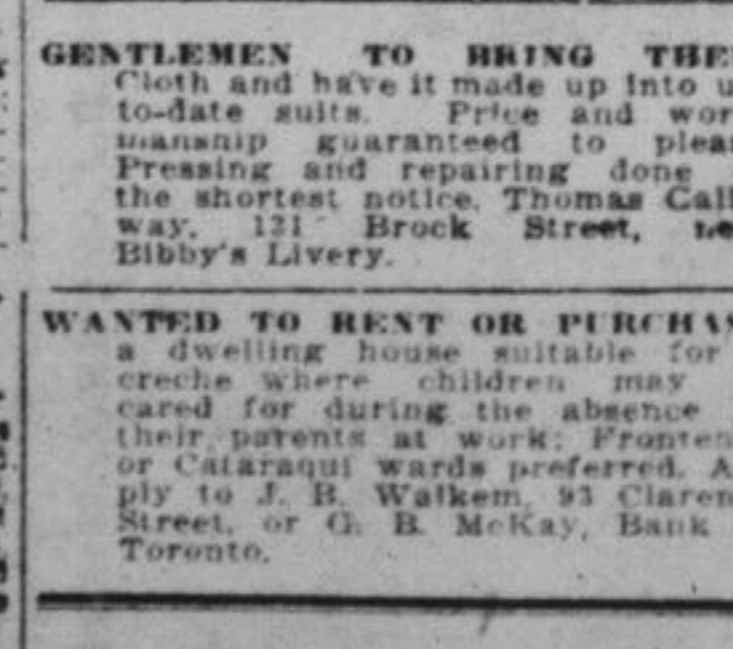
