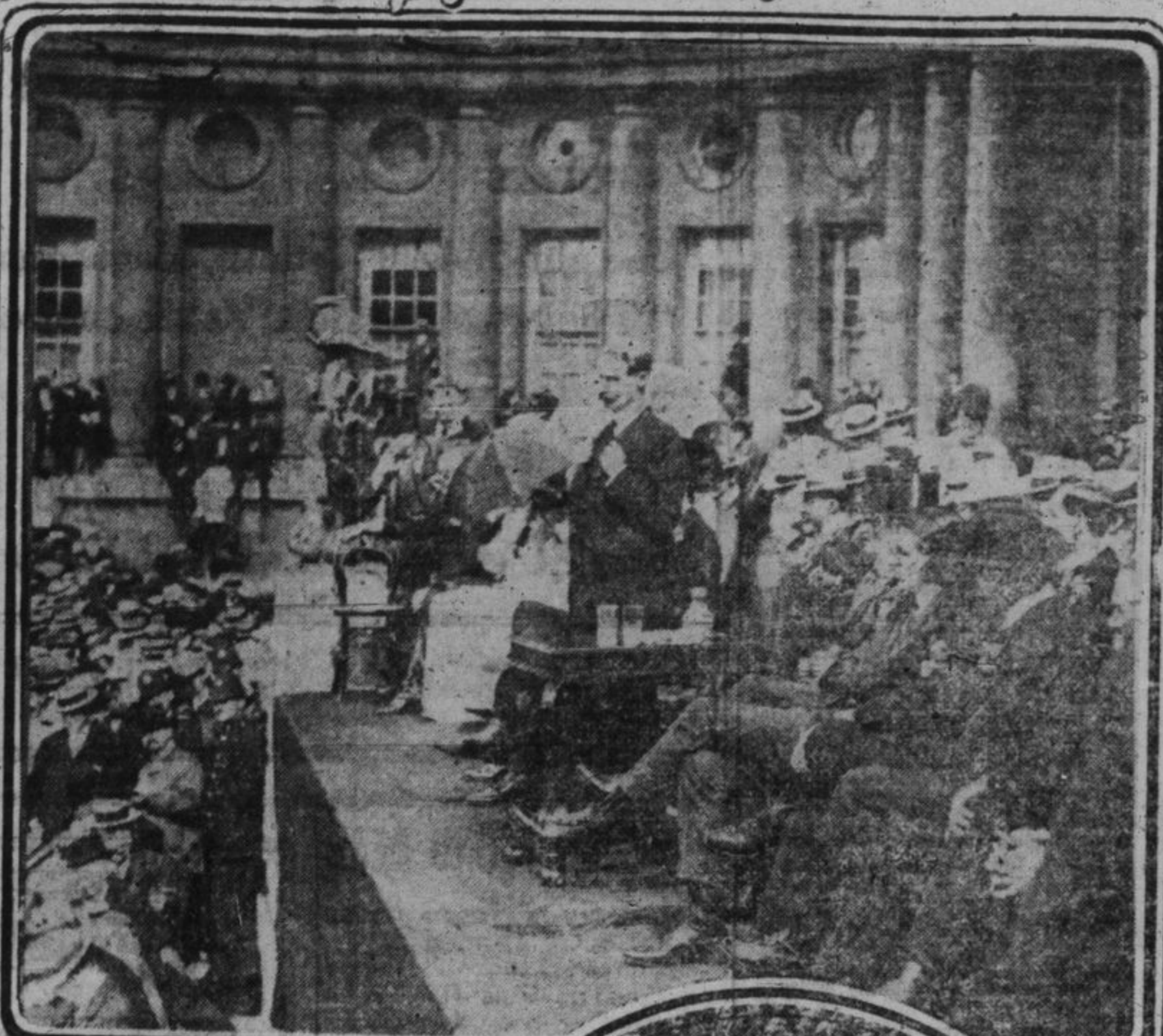

GIVES FORESTS CARE

SCOTLAND PROTECTS AND PRESERVES ITS WOODLANDS.

Dunfermline District Contains Several Well Wooded Tracts—One Contains 5,000 Acres—Trees Three Feet in Diameter.

Scotland contains a considerable number of well-preserved and imposing forests, cared for and protected for centuries.

In the Dunfermline district are several well wooded tracts, one of them containing more than 5,000 acres, with many trees over three feet in diameter.
