**MONEY MARKET TIGHT**  
HARD FOR BROKERS TO GET LARGE CALL LOANS.

Explanation of the Lassitude in Toronto Stock Market — Factors Which Imparted Strength to New York Stock Market.

Toronto, Aug. 29.—One reason that is advanced in explanation of the lassitude in the local stock market in addition to the lack of speculative interest is the growing tightness in the money market. While there is no advance on 5 1/2 per cent. in the rate for local call money, brokers are finding it more and more difficult to secure new money in loans of any size. In fact it is understood that one or two banks have issued calls for small amounts, which would be insignificant as regards the amount called, indicate a condition of "tight money." Some brokers on the other hand, whose needs are moderate, state that they have experienced no difficulty in securing sufficient money for their requirements.

**Strength of Stock Market.**  
New York, Aug. 29.—The congressional recess further confirmation from high official and unofficial quarters, of the brilliant crop outlook, and unabated demand for steel, iron and copper were the chief factors which imparted general strength to yesterday's stock market. London's higher range for our securities was also a favorable influence, albeit the matter inquiry for Americans at that rate probably had its origin at this end.

Opening prices showed gains in all the standard issues, with one and two point advances, respectively, in St. Paul and Canadian Pacific, the latter being especially strong abroad on buying attributed to Berlin, Hariman and Hill stocks, as well as the entire stranger group, manifested an upward tendency.

**Crop Moving Period.**  
New York, Aug. 29.—Wall Street is now entering upon the crop-moving period, and the demands of interior bankers upon this centre are becoming heavier. During the past week alone local banks sent \$10,000,000 in round numbers, to the agricultural sections, most of it through the sub-treasury.

Canada is withdrawing funds from New York. Germany is again bidding for funds here. And next week our banks will be called upon to meet September interest and dividend payments of approximately \$110,000,000.

Germany has been taking gold from England, and as the latter country has heavy payments to make in India and Egypt, it is not unlikely that she will be compelled to transfer to New York the weight of her gold obligations to South America. American foreign credits have been exhausted, and new credits can not be built up until the new crop of cotton begins to move toward Europe.

Actual monetary stringency threatens on both sides of the Atlantic, and because of this fact new capital issues have been held up, although some of our railroads are so sorely pressed for funds that they have been borrowing notes to finance current needs.

It may be possible for the banks to avoid a general calling of loans by the process of shifting them, so often resorted to in the past. But in this connection it is to be remembered that September 10th is the date set by the comptroller of the currency as the time limit within which all national banks must bring their loan accounts within the legal limit.

**Financial Tidings.**  
Cheese shipments from Montreal from May 1st to date have been 966,556 boxes; same date, 1911, 1,030,255 boxes; 1910, 1,019,386.

A dividend will shortly be declared on the capital stock of the Muskoka Lakes Navigation and Hotel company. The Hare Machinery company, Galt, Ont., capitalized at \$400,000, it was announced, will build a plant at a cost of \$100,000. The site has already been secured.

**GOLD WIRE IN ARTERY.**  
New York Man, After Unusual Operations, Dies of Tuberculosis.

New York, Aug. 29.—Thirty-six feet of gold wire put in a spiral inside the walls of the aorta of Oscar Nielson, in one of the most, if not the most, remarkable operations for aneurism ever performed in this city, prevented the great artery from bursting and thus causing death, but Nielson is dead in Bellevue hospital, of pulmonary tuberculosis. He was suffering from the disease at the time of the unusual operation, July 31st last. Dr. William C. Lusk performed the operation and the staff at Bellevue declared it has been singularly successful, and that if Nielson had not been afflicted with tuberculosis he might have left the hospital in a short time.

**LYNCHED A PRIEST.**  
Infuriated Mob in a Portuguese Town Sought Revenge.

Lisbon, Aug. 29.—Despatches received here from the Portuguese town of Aldeia Obispo tell of the putting to death of a priest by an infuriated mob. The parish priest, it is alleged, attempted to conduct a funeral and the authorities and the people of the town objected. In the scuffle which ensued the priest, whose surplice was torn, beat an elderly man, and was placed under arrest. On the pretext of changing his surplice he accompanied an officer the priest went to the presbytery and secured a revolver, with which he shot the policeman dead.

The inhabitants, infuriated by this act, stormed the presbytery and after seizing the priest lynched him. Burial of the body, which was horribly mutilated in the local cemetery was opposed by the angry crowd.

At Douai, France, Lieut. Louis Felix M. Chamberier, of the Aviation Corps, was burned to death while flying in his aeroplane.

**LAUNCHING AT GLASGOW**  
Of the C.P.R. Steamer Empress of Russia.

Glasgow, Aug. 29.—There was a huge crowd of spectators to witness the launching of the steamer Empress of Russia at Glasgow, yesterday, of the two new Empress steamers ordered by the Canadian Pacific Railway company. The launching of the new vessel was performed by Mrs. H. Wyndham Beauchamp, the eldest daughter of Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, president of the C.P.R. Amongst those present and in the unavoidable absence of A. Piers, the European steamship manager of the C.P.R., was George McL. Brown, the European manager of the C.P.R., who represented the company.

Her sister ship, the Empress of Asia, will be launched in the course of the next two months. Both vessels are being built for the C.P.R. by the Fairfield Shipbuilding and Engineering company, of Glasgow, for their trans-Pacific service, and will be ready to go into service early next summer.

They are very much larger than any of the present fleet, being 590 feet in length, 68 feet beam, and 46 feet in depth, and gross tonnage about 15,000. The turbine system of propulsion has been adopted by the C.P.R. for the first time in these two vessels, which are to be propelled four screws, driven by four sets of Parsons' turbines and will have an average speed at sea of eighteen knots per hour. They embody all the latest improvements both for the safety and comfort of passengers.

In the construction of these vessels a radical departure from the current practice has been made in constructing them with cruiser sterns and the rudders entirely underhung. This form of stern, besides giving the vessels a very distinctive appearance, increases the effective length of "water-line," whereby assisting propulsion, and also adds considerably to the available deck space at the after end. The vessels will have five decks and in addition a long combined forecastle and bridge deck. Above the bridge deck will be located the principal first-class public rooms with the officers' quarters and navigating bridge overhead. In the dining saloon tables have been arranged to suit the demands of various passengers. Small tables will be provided to accommodate two and four persons and larger ones for parties of six will be arranged in alcoves, whilst there will be still larger tables for other parties.

Accommodation is provided for 200 first-class, 100 second-class and 800 third-class passengers, the two latter classes being for Asiatics. A number of single berth rooms as well as double berth rooms have been provided, so that the growing class of passengers who desire privacy can be taken care of. There are also a number of suites, consisting of bed room, sitting room and bath room. Besides the usual spacious dining saloon, lounge, cafe, library and writing room, a large gymnasium has been provided on the upper deck. It is to be fitted up with a large variety of exercising machines. Another feature adopted for the first time is the laundry, which will be found of great convenience especially in the hot weather on the China coast.
