NO LEAD BOUNTIES.

Dominion Government Not Paying Them Now.

Ottawa, Aug. 29.—No bounty on lead are now being paid by the Canadian government. The bounty is \$15 per ton until lead prices in London get to \$15 per ton, when the bounty ceases automatically. That figure has been reached.

The bounty of ninety cents per ton on pig iron and eighty cents per ton on electrically smelted steel will cease at the end of the year.
