### FIRST RAIL COMMUNICATION

With North Country, which is Empire in itself.

Edmonton, Alta., Sept. 13.—When the Canadian Northern railway company opened its northern branch line between Edmonton and Athabasca, ninety-six miles, a few days ago, there was established the first rail communication with the north-country, which is an empire in itself, also connecting with a system of commercial waterways, serving a territory of 2,000 miles in length and 500 miles in width.

The arrival of the first locomotive with a train of cars, at what was formerly known as Athabasca Landing, on Sept. 10th, makes the close of an era, which began with the trappers and traders in the latter part of the eighteenth century and in this the old trail, an extension of First avenue, which bisects the business district of Edmonton, played an important part. It is an event of prime importance in the development of the mineral and agricultural resources of a practically virgin district, and it is believed the business men that rapid settlement will follow.

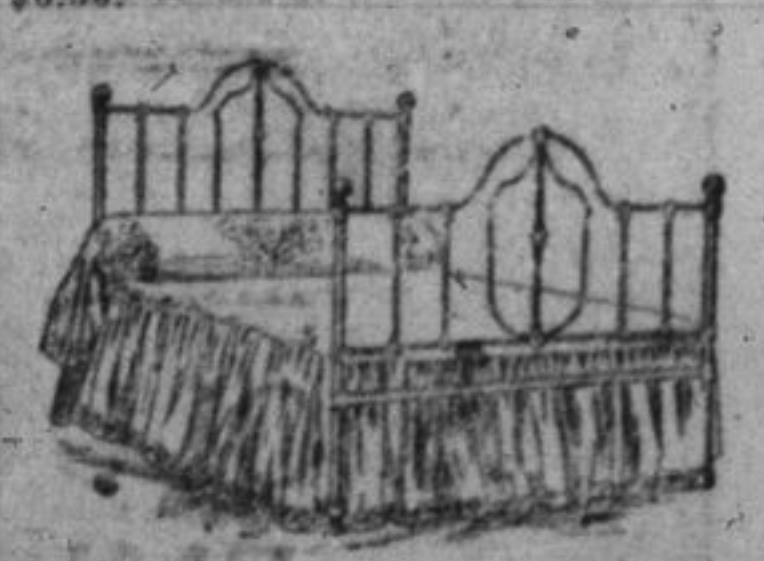
