LIKES WOMEN LIBRARIANS.
Said to be More Competent and Courteous Than Men.
Some of the prejudices against the employment of women in responsible executive posts in London libraries is being broken down. The borough of Wandsworth is beginning to blaze the trail through the rank undergrowth of prejudice that so far has debarr'd women from appointments in the large libraries, in spite of the fact that they are doing useful work in the smaller institutions. Eight out of nine metropolitan libraries in Wandsworth where women are employed have declared in favor of women as assistants, and the borough council now intends to appoint women to vacancies as they occur in their various libraries.

A well-known librarian even goes so far as to assert that the public prefer the woman assistant, characterizing her as more courteous and more tactful than her male counterpart, who is too often apt to assume the manners peculiar to the jack-in-office. The path of the woman librarian is likely to be still further smoothed if there is a good response to the invitation of the education committee of the library association extended to the public to enter for courses of lectures on literary history and bibliography. The wider the knowledge of the proper use of books among readers the easier will become the work of librarians, much of whose time is occupied in answering elementary questions.

But even if other public libraries copy the example set by Wandsworth, there is not likely to be a great rush by women for appointments, owing to the low scale of pay prevailing and the small hope of advancement.

DIG THEIR OWN GRAVES.

English Army Methods in the Execution of Condemned Spies.
The ceremony of disposing of a condemned spy in the English army always follows a definite precedent.
The unfortunate man is surrounded by a detachment of infantry, and after he is provided with a pick and shovel he is marched off to a selected spot and ordered to dig his own grave. This done, the tools are taken from him and his eyes are bandaged. The attending chaplain reads portions selected from the burial service, and from the ranks of the escort twelve men are selected at random by the officer in charge.
These men, having stacked their own rifles, are led to where twelve other rifles are awaiting them, six of which are loaded with blank cartridges. One of these is handed to each man, so that no one knows whether the rifle he holds contains a bullet or not, and none can say for certain that the shot fired by him killed the prisoner. The firing party then marches to an appointed position. The commands "Present!" "Fire!" are given, and almost before the last word rings out the volley is fired and the spy falls into the grave he has dug.
Nearly every man is more or less affected on being selected to form one of the firing party, and many men have been known to faint away on being singled out, while others are so overcome as to be scarcely able to pull the triggers of their rifles.
