



NEED NOT LOOK FOR PARTITION OF AMAL. COPPER.

Boston, Sept. 17 .- Those who have been looking for the dissolution of the Amalgamated Copper Co. in the near future, will be disanpointed. At the present time the of cost; and no trouble & management has no such intentions. nor has the subject been officially touched upon at directors' meet

From time to time the 'Street' has had various reasons to offer as to why Amalgamated should dissolve, the chief contention being that the company's sole duty of late had been the custody of Anaconda's control through stock ownership. To this the reply is made that Amalgamated has many other functions.

Since the realignment of the Butte camp under control of the Anaconda Co. and the acquisition of the entire capital stock of the United Metals Co., 'Amalgamated has become responsible for the sale of more copper metal annually than any other individual agency in the world. Sales of about half a billion pounds of copper a year may now be considered the company's most important function. Based upon the Selling Co's disbursements to former stockholders, Amalgamed will receive at least \$1,000,000 Eighty Per Cent. in Chicago's Vice per annum from this source alone. The official answer to statement hat dissolution might be attempted 's, therefore, that 'Amalgamated's interests are still sufficiently diversified and large to warrant the maintenance of its corporate exist-
