S. R. Dow, whose brokerage concern failed, was also president of Franklin, Indiana, North Lake, Algoma and Corbin Copper companies, from which he has resigned. R. M. Edwards, of Houghton, Mich., who succeeds as president, admits that the companies are placed in a bad financial position by the failure in the government's suit to dissolve the American Sugar Refining company, testimony in which is being taken before a special examiner, were resumed in New York yesterday.

Directors of the Ontario and Western railroad elected Charles S. Mellen president to succeed Thomas P. Fowler, who resigned.
