WAS HIS GREATEST CHARACTER ISTIC, SAYS A WRITER.

Had to Overcome Many Obstacles-His Satirical Humor-A Stern Political Moralist.

By a writer in Toronto Star, "If asked to put into a word Sir Richard Cartwright's distinguished characteristic, the word which would best describe him is force," said one who knew him well. "His physique, mentality and methods, all suggested it. His bolts were forged with the strokes of a trip hammer, and porjected with the force of a seige gun. He was equipped for public life by an application and study which few public men on this side of the Atlantic have been able to afford. With inelinations naturally running toward financial questions he gave to econprofession and devoting himself for and health, is crowing louder as he goes along thirty years entirely to politicscause from which he could not hope in case of success for anything more than an opportunity to serve his LAJ country."

An expression of opinion, upon this subject by Sir Richard during one of the budgets debates is interesting: "I have no objection whatever," he said, "to any man accumulating as large a fortune as he can by honest and legitimate means. do not mean to say that I regard it as the highest aim and object in life, and I may say this, that if that be regarded as the highest end and object of life we would not be engaged in politics, for my experience in politics is this, that although many men have entered office rich and left it poor, no honest or honorable man ever entered office poor and left it rich.'

The grain feed should be doubled after lambing and the quantity of roots (mangels or turnips) increased to nearly all they will eat. This will comes stunted and small. After that age they can more easily be helped: by other foods.

The reason for not feeding the ewes largely with roots before water and when eaten in large quantities seem to affect the foetus so the lambs are born soft and weak and very difficult to save. Either turnips or mangels can be fed to ewes with safety, although very many prefer turnips before lambing and mangels after, because the latter are considered better milk producers. But mangels should never be fed to rams. They have the effect of producing stone in the bladder, and sometimes cause serious loss. Turnips do not have this effect and sheep should have pasture.
