## COMPULSORY TRAINING HOUSE WAS BURNED

IN PHYSICAL WORK AT QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY.

Which Has Decided Upon a Step in the Right Direction—All Freshmen Must Undergo Medical Examination.

Queen's University is taking a long step in the right direction this fall. Every first-year student will have to spend two hours a week in regular classes in the gymnasium. The freshmen in science have had compulsory physical drill for a number of years and have benefited by it to so marked a degree that the authorities have decided on an enlarged scheme to embrace students in all faculties. Medical supervision is to be an integral part of the new plan. Every student entering the university will have to undergo a searching medical examination and all who will all candidates for places on the various athletic teams. The authorities are fortunate in having so competent a medical supervisor as Dr. Frederick Etherington, until recently professor of anatomy in Queen's and an old rugby football captain. FIREFMEN CALLED TO OLD FRAME BUILDING.

It Was Unoccupied, and Believed to Have Been Set on Fire by Boys—Townley-Horne Box Factory Had a Narrow Escape From Being Destroyed.

At 4:35 o'clock, on Wednesday afternoon, fire started in a small frame house on Upper William street, which is unoccupied, and the place was almost totally destroyed. The house was formerly occupied by Patrick Lennan, and is owned by Mr. Lavary, who lives in Ireland. The house has not been occupied for some time and has been used by a crowd of boys as a rendezvous. It is believed that the fire was started by some of the boys dropping lighted matches. One line of hose was used on the building. A telephone call to the Brock street station summoned the department. The building was an old land mark.

At 9:30 o'clock Wednesday night wires came in contact with some of the branches of trees on Clergy street, near Brock, and it was feared that there would be some trouble, but it was averted. There came very near being a serious fire, on Wednesday night, at the Townley-Horne Box factory, at the foot of Princess street. A man passing the factory, about 7:30 o'clock, could smell something burning, and hurried over to the fire station on Ontario street, and gave an alarm. A couple of firemen secured entrance to the factory, by way of one of the windows, and found that a fire had started on the second floor, and burned a hole in the floor. The fire was soon extinguished with slight damage, but had it not been discovered in time there would have been a lively blaze.

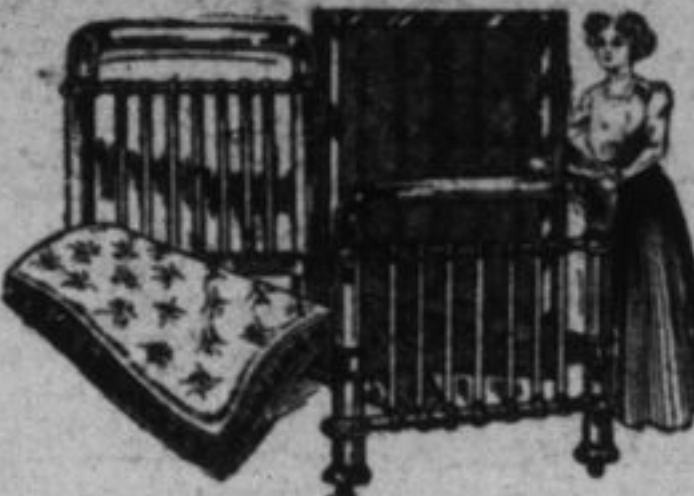

QUEEN'S RUGBY TEAM

TO MEET OTTAWA COLLEGE ON SATURDAY.

The Players Are in Good Condition—Having Their Final Practices—The Line-up Not Announced.

Queen's senior rugby team had another tussle with the pickup on Wednesday afternoon, with over thirty men in uniform, and they realize that there are only two more practices before they leave on Saturday morning for Ottawa to do battle with Father Stanton's tricky team, possessing the fastness and steadiness which the press of the Capital has credited to them. Today's team, which has been picked, though not announced, had a work-out, each position being held down by what is thought to be the best developed rugby material in Queen's. If a practice is held on Friday, it will be a light one, so that the boys will be in as good shape as possible for the clash with Ottawa college.

The spectators who have decorated the area line in large numbers, especially during the past few days, have noticed the decided advancement which the boys have made since the first of the week under Coach E. O. Slinger. Prof. MacDonald, president of the football club, has handled the white ball and assisted in putting the team "through its turns." Dr. Platt who in the past was active in Queen's athletic circles, and who played the game while attending college, was seen on the campus on Wednesday afternoon "giving pointers" on the work of the wings and scrimmage.

For a time the back division of the first team, was pitted against its probable forward line, the other positions being held down by effective men. The signals worked well.

John Aird had his knee badly strained while at practice on Tuesday, which will likely put him out of rugby for the season. Although he had played in the inter-faculty games last year, it appears this season is his first appearance at practice with the aspirants for places on the university teams. Smith and McQuay were new figures on the campus on Wednesday. The rugbyists were medically examined yesterday and to-day.

From what can be learned, the Ottawa College team is very light and in very good condition. From their talk they expect to "trim the heads" of Queen's. The latter players are keeping their mouths closed, and when they meet Father Stanton's outfit they may give them a surprise.

A student who happened to be in Ottawa at the first of the week, had occasion to see the Ottawa College team, and states that it is very fast, but light. While he was at a practice of the team, a man near by took out a book and started to make notes, but was soon spotted by the team, and the spectators were put out of the grounds.

## Health and Beauty Answers

A. F. S.: To be sure, health and falling hair of which you speak. To restore your scalp to a healthy condition, first keep it clean by shampooing every ten days or two weeks with a mild soap, then massage the scalp using a good quality hair-cream. You can prepare the tonic yourself by adding one ounce of quinine to a half-pint of alcohol (not whiskey) and a half-pint of cold water. This is much better than any ready-prepared hair tonics as it contains nothing to make the hair coarse, sticky or "stringy." It will remove the dandruff and stop your hair from coming out. Use it for four ounces daily for the hair and very refreshing to a itching scalp.

B. M. D.: Do not let your superfluous flesh worry you. Even though you have spent many dollars trying different so-called "flesh-reducers" without any of them doing a bit of good, I want you to try this one. I have many friends who tell me it did wonders for them. Get a dependable pharmacist from any drug store, dissolve it in 1-2 pints hot water and take a teaspoonful a few minutes before each meal. It is harmless and will not do you any harm. It is necessary for dieting or strenuous exercise.

Mary F.: By devoting just a little time each day to the care of your complexion, you can save out of the marks of approaching autumn and have the same attractive, youthful-looking features as your younger friends. Use a good, grainless complexion cream (see answer to Dorris) and instead of blotting up the pores of your skin with face powder, get a dependable toilet and use it exclusively. You can make such a lotion by buying four ounces of spermaceti or vaseline and dissolve it in one-half pint which basal or hot water; then add two teaspoonfuls glycerine and when cold, apply freely to your face, neck and arms. This lotion is inexpensive and unobtrusive as a skin beautifier. It does not make off or wash away, but it will keep your skin soft like face powder, and you will find it excellent for removing that sticky, muddy look from your skin. It is good for removing and preventing freckles, skin pimples and acne, and normal skin roughness.

R. W.: If my eyes continually had that tired, overworked feeling, I would use one of our eye lotions. It is a good tonic for them.
