THE SECOND VICTIM

OF RAY OF QUINTE WRECK ON WEDNESDAY.

Mrs. Augustus Fahland, of Clamb Falls, Wis., died in the Hotel Dieu from injuries she received.

The Ray of Quinte wreck of Wednesday morning claimed another victim, when Mrs. Augustus Fahland, of Clamb Falls, Wis., passed away in the Hotel Dieu on Saturday morning, at 1:30 o'clock. The deceased lady, it will be remembered, with two other women, was thrown about in the car, when the train left the track, and received bad injuries. Her injuries consisted of a broken wrist, a bad scalp wound and an injury to her chest which caused her great suffering. When picked up after the accident, Mrs. Fahland was in an unconscious condition and remained so throughout.

The deceased lady was on her way home after making a visit to her sister at Steco. She was sixty-five years of age, and a very heavily built woman. In religion she was a Roman Catholic. Mrs. John Edmunds, of Brownville, N.Y., is a sister, and she was summoned here.

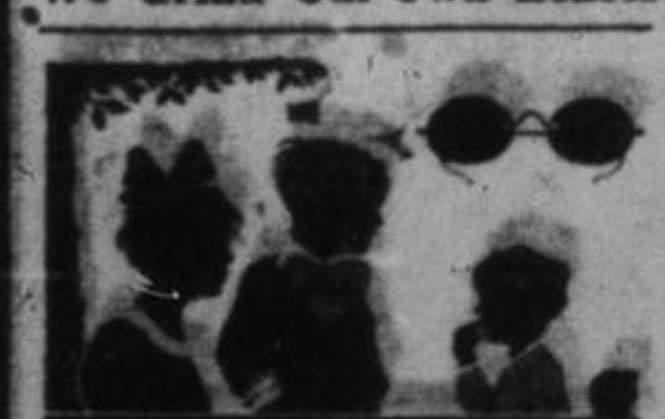
