WON'T BOW TO ULSTERITES.

Premier Asquith Takes Firm Stand on Home Rule.

Ladybank, Fifehire, Scotland, Oct. 5.—The British government will not bow to such threats as the unionist leaders made in Ulster, declared Premier Asquith, on Saturday, in speaking on Home Rule. They had, he said, raised the spirit of lawlessness but they must not imagine that they could confine their doctrine to a case which happened to be politically convenient at the moment. He continued: "I shall go to Ulster of the Irish people demand is not granted and if I have seen their long cherished aspiration frustrated they may turn and say, 'We will take the law into our own hands.' No body of responsible politicians has ever struck a more deadly blow at the foundations of the no-rate government."

Wellington, New Zealand, Oct. 5. The Christ Church Sunday Mail's correspondent telegraphs to New Zealand Members of parliament urging that the ministry communicate with the Australian government with a view of jointly inviting Mr. Churchill to extend his tour to Australasia in order that he may visit Canada, in order to enlighten the people upon the question of foreign policy, and confer on the question of imperial defence.
