

CONCERNING FAMILY OF SIR RICHARD CARTWRIGHT.

Continually Grew Worse Until Or, Grardfather's Spirit Shown in Sir Richard-Grandfather Lived in Kingston and Died in the Year of Waterloo.

> By a curious coincidence, just , the day after Sir Richard Cartwright was buried in Cataraqui cemetery, there was received by Dr. A. G. Doughty, the dominion archivist at Ottawa, a copy of a funeral sermon preached for Sir Richard's grandtather in 1815 by the Rev. John Stracken, the great Canadian churchman. The sermon was delivered in Kingston on Sept. 3rd of Waterloo year, and (printed by W Wraye of Montreal. The copy, which has been received at the archives, is one which Bishop Strachan sent to the Free Church leader, Dr Chalmers, and bears on the title page the 'iascription "Rev.
