N. M. Patterson & Co., Fort William, grain brokers, are building a new 100,000 bushel grain elevator and will do it in forty days.

Charles H. Ritchie, K.C., of the firm of Ritchie, Ludwig and Bellantyne, Toronto, recognized as one of the leaders of the Ontario bar, will be offered the appointment of high court judge.

James Weldon, sr., aged seventy-eight years, a well-known feed dealer at Watertown, N.Y., is dead.

At a meeting of the creditors of the defunct stock brokerage firm of R. B. Lyman & Co., held at Buffalo, N.Y., it was announced that the total liabilities were \$385,762, and the assets \$100,421.

Hon. Sam Hughes, minister of militia and defence, will grant the request of Armand Lavergne that he be sent as a Canadian attaché to the army of the Balkan confederacy.

The disturbance in the lower St. Lawrence Valley Tuesday has developed into a severe storm now centered in Newfoundland while the area of highest pressure covers the great lakes and middle states.

The weather continues fine and warm in the western provinces.

WEDDING IN HAND WORTH MANY PROMISES. London, Oct. 16. - "First she would and then she wouldn't," an old vaudeville ditty, which was the rage of London some thirty years ago, might well be made the title of a little drama in real life that was played at Dunghaven, Londonderry, the other day.

The girl was in a quandary what to do, and "you'll have no luck if you go away" from the rival aviator settled the matter. She decided not to go, and got married immediately rather than chance the American wedding next month.

The brother of the girl, who was accompanying her, sympathized with the disappointed bridegroom, who now was in tears and said he could not go to America, because "I don't know the way," he said.

There was an immediate wedding, amid tremendous rejoicing in Dunghaven, and all the muzzle loading guns in the town were brought out and fired incessantly.

CALL FOR REFORMS. Whiskers and Evening Garb Burning Topics in London. London, Oct. 16. - With the approach of winter the old question of the reform of men's evening clothes crops up again.

The decline of two points in the Department of Labor's index number of wholesale prices for the month of July, after a continuous rise for twelve months, was followed in August by another drop, the index number standing at 133.4 as compared with 134.8 the previous month.

Still Going Down. The decline during August was due chiefly to decreases in prices of grains and fodder, fruits and vegetables, with slight increases in dairy products, fish, metals and coal.

Leads All Canada. For the first time in its history the city of St. Catharines, Ont., holds the greatest percentage of increase in building permits of all the cities in the Dominion.

Experimental Farm at Fredericton. The Dominion Government has purchased seventy-five acres of land for an experimental farm at Fredericton, N.B.

THEY RIDE TO SCHOOL

"Consolidated" System a Boon to Manitoba Children.

As a consequence of the scattered population of Manitoba, what is known as "consolidation of schools" has been brought forward.

A necessary accompaniment of consolidation is the conveyance to and from the school each day at the public expense, all children of school age who live over a certain distance from the school house.

In Eastern Canada, consolidation was introduced as part of the "Macdonald Scheme" in Nova Scotia in 1903; in New Brunswick and Ontario in 1904; in Prince Edward Island in 1906.

Manitoba may properly be termed the "Mecca" of consolidation in Canada. Here the people have taken hold of the plan from the first.

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MONKS WERE ROBBED.

Ginseng Worth \$500 Pillaged at Oka Monastery.

The caterpillar pest has ruined the apple crop in the Two Mountain district save in the Trappist orchards.

The Trappist Monks, through the work of one of their members, Rev. Father Leopold, the horticulturist, and one of the youngest and most distinguished Fathers of that order.

It was a hard fight to keep ahead of the enemy this year, said one of the veteran monks who has spent forty years in the cloister.

Recently, during a severe storm, robbers entered the ginseng garden situated in the woods some distance from the monastery.

When the reporter visited the place things looked as if the marauders were making a second attempt on the premises.

THE MINYAN MAN.

Unique Profession Found Amongst the Jews.

A peculiar profession that has been in existence for a great number of years in some of the influential synagogues of the metropolis is that of a "minyán man."

The word "minyán," which is of Hebrew origin, denotes a quorum of ten adult males above the age of thirteen necessary to attend a place of worship to enable a service to be fully and properly conducted.

The reason for this universal custom, which is an essential in Hebrew congregations, and strictly adhered to by orthodox Jews, derives its significance from the fact that the Psalmist which says, "God standeth in the congregation of God," this signifying that the Divine glory rests in the midst of the congregation when this number is present.

The ginseng plant of a famous medicinal plant prized by the Chinese as such is being cultivated by the monks. At present there are several acres under cultivation, the value of which is \$40,000.
