The College Youths, some of whom are promising lads of fourscore, have never rung a complete peal on Bow bells, because with twelve bells there are .479,001,600 possible changes and to ring these would take nearly thirtyeight years. Their peal on twelve bella -technically called a "maximus"-is thus never more than a fraction of what it might be .- London Family




