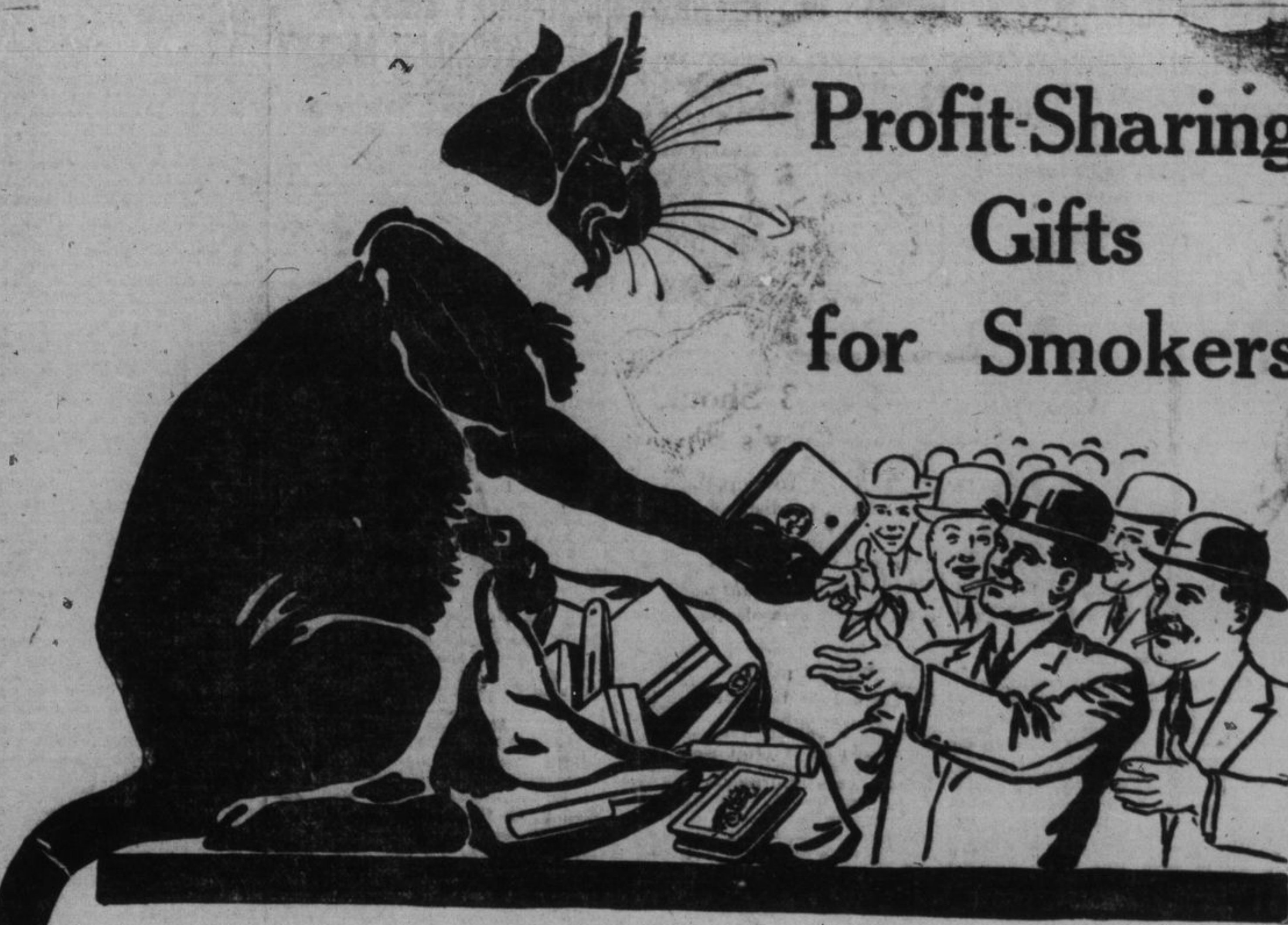
Elizabeth smiled assuringly at her father, who made an abrupt motion, at which the doctor turned away. It was Dr. Brand.
