TWO DEATHS IN WEST

OF FORMER RESIDENTS OF THE NAPANEE DISTRICT.

The Late Daniel Haycock and Mrs. Frank Hawley—Remains of the Latter Being Brought to Napanee for Interment. Napanee, Oct. 26.—Two sad deaths were reported from the west last week and came as shocks to the relatives in Napanee. The first was that of David Haycock, well known in Napanee and vicinity. Deceased left here in August to work in the harvest fields during the fall, and nothing was heard of his illness until the message came announcing his death.

Again on Saturday the sad news was received of the death at McGeo, Sask., of Mrs. Frank Hawley, eldest daughter of John McGeo, Slush Road. The death in this case was also very sudden. One little son four years of age, besides the husband, is bereft of a loving mother and wife. The remains are being brought to Napanee for interment.
