HED SUDDENLY IN MONTREAL, SATURDAY AFTERNOON.

Born Sixty-three Years Ago-Created a Baronet in 1908.

Montreal, Nov. 25 .- The death of Sir Edward Seyburn Clouston, Bart, one of the best known bankers and financiers of Canada, occurred here Satarday atternoon. His age was sixty-

Sir Edward lamted in the morning while engaged in conversation with a friend in the Royal Securities build-Recovering a few moments later ie objected to being removed to the ospital, contending that he was all On the advice of his friends, nowever, he allowed himself to be conveyed to the Royal Victoria hospital where an examination was made.

The hospital authorities at first issued a bulletin announcing that the baronet's condition was not very serious, and that the fainting fit had been brought about by acute indigestion About 2.30 p.m., Sir Edward's condition began to grow rapidly worse, and he passed away at 2.45 o'clock, death due to apoplexy. deceased financier was the son
