### THE KING OF BULGARIA

To Visit the European Chancellories in the Spring.

Sofia, Bulgaria, Dec. 10.—King Ferdinand announced to-day that in the early spring he would make a tour of European chancellories in an effort to promote peace and secure recognition of the Balkan league as a world power.

A Lecture on "Korea."  
 A lecture was delivered in St. Andrew's hall, on Monday evening, by Rev. S. J. M. Compton, on "Korea." The talk was illustrated by slides, which gave a vivid idea of the country, the people, their customs, beliefs and the work of the Presbyterian church in that country. He also described the situation of Korea as a nation, how that in 1895 she had gained her independence and had enjoyed independent life until 1904 when Japan began to exert her influence. In 1907 Japan took full control. He pointed out Japan's influence on the educational life of the country and Japan's treatment of Christians.

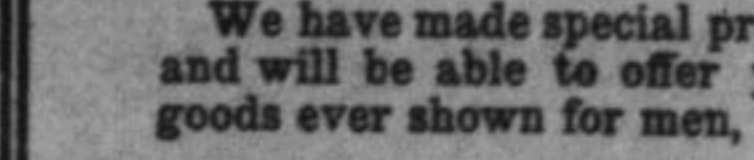
