CITY COUNCIL SESSION

ALD. RIGNEY RESIGNED HIS SEAT IN COUNCIL

To Take Effect on January 6th—City Land to be Rented to the Buffalo-Ontario Smelting Company, With Right to Purchase.

It was principally business of a routine nature transacted by the City Council Monday evening. Committee reports were passed and preparations made for the municipal elections on January 6th. Ald. Rigney resigned his seat as representative for Ontario ward, to take effect on election day, when he would go to the polls for the mayoralty.
